
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The legislature finds that the Hawaii
2 state hospital has faced a number of recurring issues over the
3 past several years, including workplace safety issues,
4 employment and human resources matters, and difficulty meeting
5 the needs of patients due to the inefficient use of facilities.
6 Although the legislative and executive branches have attempted
7 to address these issues through investigative committees and
8 special action teams, concerns about the administration of the
9 hospital persist.

10 The need for the continued concern was made evident by the
11 recent high profile escape of a committed patient from the
12 hospital. The legislature finds that this escape, perhaps the
13 most visible incident at the hospital in recent history, was
14 unfortunately not an isolated incident. In fact, there have
15 been over one hundred escape incidents, also known as
16 "elopements", from the Hawaii state hospital since 2001. This



1 high figure has raised justifiable concerns about public safety
2 from the residents of the windward Oahu community.

3 In response to these concerns, the Hawaii state hospital
4 has taken a number of corrective actions, including:

- 5 (1) Placing employees involved in the recent high profile
6 escape on administrative leave pending an
7 investigation by the attorney general;
- 8 (2) Completing a public safety audit;
- 9 (3) Consulting with the Oahu community correctional center
10 and the Colorado Mental Health Institute to
11 investigate the use of GPS monitoring;
- 12 (4) Adding additional fencing on the hospital campus;
- 13 (5) Creating a satellite medical unit and lab station to
14 reduce the number of patient transports;
- 15 (6) Preparing the relocation of certain programs pending
16 security enhancements;
- 17 (7) Requiring that all patients leaving secured areas wear
18 restraints;
- 19 (8) Suspending off-grounds escorted privileges;
- 20 (9) Implementing new procedures for census counts;
- 21 (10) Conducting additional unannounced unit searches;



1 (11) Retraining staff; and

2 (12) Relocating a security post to improve visibility.

3 In addition to these actions, the legislature notes that
4 the Hawaii state hospital has established a security corrective
5 action plan. The hospital has already implemented portions of
6 the plan, including updating its communication plan to notify
7 the community in case of an escape and the installation of new
8 locking systems, security window screens, and fences to improve
9 security. However, the legislature finds that implementing
10 other portions of the plan will require an additional investment
11 of resources.

12 (b) The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
13 department of health to implement the outstanding
14 recommendations of the Hawaii state hospital security corrective
15 action plan.

16 Specifically, this Act:

17 (1) Appropriates funds for the purchase of electronic
18 ankle monitoring bracelets and additional metal
19 detector hand wands;



1 (2) Appropriates funds for the purchase and installation
2 of additional lighting and closed circuit television
3 cameras; and

4 (3) Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds to
5 fund capital improvement projects at the Hawaii state
6 hospital campus to improve hospital security.

7 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$35,000 or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
10 purchase of electronic ankle monitoring bracelets and metal
11 detector hand wands for the Hawaii state hospital.

12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13 health for the purposes of this section.

14 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000 or so much
16 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
17 purchase and installation of perimeter lighting and signage on
18 the Hawaii state hospital campus.

19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
20 health for the purposes of this section.



1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much
 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2018-2019 for the
 4 purchase and installation of closed circuit television cameras
 5 at the Hawaii state hospital to monitor new security fencing
 6 areas and other portions of the campus.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 8 health for the purposes of this section.

9 SECTION 5. The director of finance is authorized to issue
 10 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
 11 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
 12 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2018-2019
 13 for the purpose of capital improvement projects for the Hawaii
 14 state hospital, as follows:

15 1. Replacement of the sally port gate #1 at unit F with a
 16 rolling gate.

10 4. Design and construction of a security fence encompassing
11 the Hawaii state hospital campus, possibly including the
12 Aloha Garden.

16 SECTION 6. The appropriation made for the capital
17 improvement projects authorized by section 5 of this Act shall
18 not lapse at the end of the fiscal biennium for which the
19 appropriation is made; provided that all moneys from the
20 appropriation unencumbered as of June 30, 2020, shall lapse as
21 of that date.



1 SECTION 7. The sums appropriated for the respective
2 capital projects set forth in section 5 shall be expended by the
3 department of health for the purposes of that section.

4 SECTION 8. The department of health shall submit a report
5 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
6 convening of the regular sessions of 2019, 2020, and 2021. The
7 report shall include:

- 8 (1) An update of the department's progress in implementing
9 the security corrective action plan;
- 10 (2) The number of elopements, if any, during the previous
11 year; and
- 12 (3) Any other findings and recommendations, including any
13 proposed legislation.

14 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
