SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING STATE AND COUNTY AGENCIES TO COMPILE DIGITAL RECORDS OF
EXISTING ANALOG DATA AND ADOPT DIGITAL DATA STORAGE
METHODS.

1 WHEREAS, a recent audit of the City and County of Honolulu
2 Department of Community Services revealed that the Department
3 workers hand write complaints in composition books, without a
4 digital copy, which is time consuming and prevents efficient
5 access to the recorded data; and
6

7 WHEREAS, without efficient access to an agency's data, it
8 is difficult to judge the effectiveness of agency programs; and
9

10 WHEREAS, digital transformation of analog records and data
11 by public agencies can increase efficiency by allowing
12 government workers to access information from multiple locations
13 and reduce costs, as hours otherwise spent writing and filing by
14 hand are saved; and

16 WHEREAS, adoption of online filing and digital storage
17 methods can allow for analytics on the process and allow for
18 better auditing of government functions; and

20 WHEREAS, increasingly mobile citizens rely on technology in
21 their lives and expect public information to be available on
22 digital platforms; and

24 WHEREAS, public agencies across the country, at all levels
25 of government, are focusing on the need to modernize legacy
26 systems, enhance sharing and analysis of public data, and
27 satisfy mobile citizens; and

29 WHEREAS, access to agency data is imperative to the State's
30 commitment to solving Hawaii's issues; now, therefore,



1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-ninth

 17 and Natural Resources; Director of Public Safety; Director of
 18 Taxation; Director of Transportation; President of the
 19 University of Hawaii System; Chief Procurement Officer; Mayor of
 20 the City and County of Honolulu; Mayor of the County of Maui;
 21 Mayor of the County of Hawaii; and Mayor of the County of Kauai.
