Exempts gross receipts from the sale of mobility enhancing equipment,
durable medical equipment, prosthetic devices, prescription drugs sold
pursuant to a doctor's prescription, diabetic supplies, medical oxygen,
and human blood and its derivatives from the general excise tax.
Amends the definition of "prosthetic device" to include devices worn
on the body. Amends the definition of "prescription drugs". Effective
1/1/2019. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2018. (SD2)
