<u>SB 2201, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2527)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BOARDS. Removes the word "examiners" from the state board of chiropractic examiners, board of dental examiners, board of examiners in optometry, and board of veterinary examiners. Renames the boards with titles that accurately reflect their scope and duties. (SD1)	IAC, CPC
<u>SB 2053, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2528)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ATHLETIC TRAINERS. Makes permanent the regulation of athletic trainers. (SD1)	IAC, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 3082, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2536)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VIRTUAL CURRENCY. Extends the money transmitters act to expressly apply to persons engaged in the transmission of virtual currency. Requires a licensee dealing with virtual currency to provide a warning to a consumer prior to entering into an agreement with the consumer. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	IAC, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 2773, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2903)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THIRD PARTY ADMINISTRATORS. Encourages disclosure of contracts between insurers and third party administrators to potential insureds and the insurance commissioner. Promotes the financial responsibility of third party administrators. Regulates third party administrators' practices. Governs the qualifications and procedures for the licensing of third party administrators. Effective 1/1/2019. (SD2)	IAC, CPC, FIN
<u>SB 2704, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR2827)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO WIRELESS BROADBAND FACILITIES. Establishes a process to upgrade and support next generation wireless broadband infrastructure throughout the State. Establishes a permitting, application, review, and approval process for wireless service providers to install wireless facilities on state or county owned utility poles, or install associated utility poles, in the right of way. Effective 7/1/2050. Applies to permit applications filed with the State or county after 12/31/2018. (SD2)	IAC, CPC

Status

RELATING TO PROFESSIONAL AND VOCATIONAL
LICENSING.

IAC, CPC

Prohibits a licensing authority from using rules to supersede requirements set forth in licensing laws and adopting rules that authorize an unlicensed individual to perform duties, activities, or functions that, if performed by another professional, would require licensure of that professional. (SD1)

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:
