<u>HB 1965</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VETERANS TREATMENT COURT. Appropriates funds to the veterans treatment court on the island of Hawaii.	VMI, JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1529</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Prohibits discrimination in the rental of real property based on a veteran's use of HUD-VASH vouchers.	VMI, HSG, JUD
<u>HB 2089</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TUITION ASSISTANCE. Permits the Adjutant General to extend the University of Hawaii tuition assistance awards to qualified retired Hawaii National Guard enlisted persons, warrant officers, and company grade officers.	VMI, HED, FIN
<u>HB 886</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FILIPINO VETERANS. Requires and funds the Office of Veterans' Services to establish a Filipino Veterans Legacy Exhibit at the Honolulu International Airport.	VMI, FIN
<u>HB 1944</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO FILIPINO VETERANS BURIAL ASSISTANCE. Establishes the Filipino American Veterans of World War II burial assistance program. Establishes the Filipino American veterans of World War II burial assistance program special fund. Makes an appropriation.	VMI, FIN



<u>HB 2036</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MEMORIALS. Appropriates funds for the planning and design of a memorial to honor service members of the recent conflicts in the Persian Gulf, Iraq, Afghanistan, and the various theaters of the Global War on Terrorism, to be located at the Hawaii State Veterans Cemetery in Kaneohe on the island of Oahu, and replicas of the memorial to be located at state veterans cemeteries statewide. <u>HB 2181</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PEARL HARBOR REMEMBRANCE DAY. Establishes each December 7 of each year as Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.	VMI, FIN
<u>HB 1223</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MILITARY IN THE ARTS. Appropriates moneys for the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts to establish an Arts in the Military Program.	VMI, FIN
<u>HB 2706</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE INTERNATIONAL MOON BASE ALLIANCE. Promotes the space industry in Hawaii by creating an international moon base alliance to provide recommendations and guidance for the establishment of an evolvable lunar architecture on the Big Island of Hawaii and to plan a development summit.	VMI, EDB, FIN

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


PAPER: 10 copies (including an original) to Room 333 in the State Capitol;

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through the website); or

WEB: For testimony less than 20MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.
