<u>SB 2205, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2831)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS. Appropriates moneys to the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts Artist Fellowship Program for the awarding of one-time fellowships to promising artists. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2580, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2848)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE KING KAMEHAMEHA CELEBRATION COMMISSION. Appropriates moneys to the department of accounting and general services to establish one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) position for the executive director of the King Kamehameha Celebration Commission. Appropriates moneys to fund the costs incurred by the annual King Kamehameha day celebration events. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2581, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2729)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE KING KAMEHAMEHA CELEBRATION COMMISSION. Increases the number of members on the King Kamehameha celebration commission from thirteen to fifteen. Establishes an executive director to be appointed by the commission. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2204, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2876)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE HAWAII STATE CAPITOL. Appropriates funds to the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts to fund celebrations for the 50th anniversary of the Hawaii state capitol. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN



<u>SB 2693, SD1</u> (SSCR2662) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE FESTIVAL OF PACIFIC ARTS. Makes an appropriation to the temporary commission on the thirteenth festival of pacific arts to plan for the historic event to be held in Honolulu from June 11 to June 27, 2020. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2896, SD1</u> (SSCR2869) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FIRST ARRIVAL OF JAPANESE EMIGRANTS TO HAWAII. Appropriates funds as a grant to the Japanese Cultural Center of Hawaii for the presentation and coordination of events and programs to celebrate and commemorate the 150th anniversary of the first arrival of Japanese emigrants to Hawaii. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2887, SD1</u> (HSCR1157-18) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS. Appropriates moneys for events recognizing the twenty-fifth anniversary of the sister state relationship between Hawaii and Taiwan. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	EDB, VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2583</u> (SSCR2526) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY. Designates June 21 of each year as International Yoga Day.	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2777, SD1</u> (SSCR2709) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE NATIONAL GUARD. Allows the Department of Defense to recoup operating costs when allowing the use or temporary rental of its facilities by the public, provided that the use or rental does not interfere with any military use. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>SB 2778, SD1</u> (SSCR2763) <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE CHARGEABLE TRANSIENT QUARTERS REVOLVING FUND. Creates a chargeable transient quarters revolving fund into which billet fees are to be deposited. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	VMI, FIN
<u>HCR 174 / HR 146 /</u> <u>Status / Status</u>	REQUESTING THE OFFICE OF VETERANS' SERVICES TO STUDY HOW THE INCREASE IN BURIAL SERVICE REQUESTS HAS AFFECTED THE HAWAII STATE VETERANS CEMETERY.	VMI, FIN

#### DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- Testifier's name with position/title and organization;
- The Committee(s) to which the comments are directed;
- The date and time of the hearing; and
- Measure number.

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:

FAX: For testimony less than 5 pages in length, transmit to 1-800-535-3859 (for Neighbor Islander without a computer to submit testimony through the website); or
