PAUL MORGAN, FOR A TERM TO EXPIRE 6-30-2022**

The Department of Land and Natural Resources supports Governor's Message 656, nominating Mr. Paul Morgan to the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board expiring June 30, 2022.

The Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board (Board) is established under Section 6E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The Board orders and enters historic properties into the Hawai'i Register of Historic Places and evaluates and recommends nominations to the National Register of Historic Places.

Mr. Paul Morgan was born and raised in Hawai'i. Mr. Morgan received a Masters of Architecture from University of Washington. Since 1991, Mr. Morgan has been a principal architect at Suzuki/Morgan Architects. Many of his projects have included preservation work. Mr. Morgan's research and presentations illustrate his expertise in the area of Hawai'i architectural history. Mr. Morgan brings his working knowledge of architecture, and specifically his knowledge of architecture in Hawai'i, to this Board.

Senate confirmation will ensure that Mr. Morgan's valuable knowledge and perspective informs the deliberations of the Hawai'i Historic Places Review Board until June 30, 2022.
