A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIFORM PARENTAGE ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 584, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§584- Court filings; minutes of proceedings; posting
- 5 requirement. The judiciary shall post on its website the titles
- 6 of all court filings and the minutes of court proceedings in
- 7 cases brought under this chapter; provided that the judiciary
- 8 shall redact information in which an individual has a
- 9 significant privacy interest under section 92F-14."
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 571-84, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) The court shall maintain records of all cases brought
- 13 before it. Except as provided in [section] sections 571-84.6[$_{7}$]
- 14 and 584- , in proceedings under section 571-11 and in paternity
- 15 proceedings under chapter 584, the following records shall be
- 16 withheld from public inspection: the court docket, petitions,
- 17 complaints, motions, and other papers filed in any case;



- 1 transcripts of testimony taken by the court; and findings,
- 2 judgments, orders, decrees, and other papers other than social
- 3 records filed in proceedings before the court. The records
- 4 other than social records shall be open to inspection: by the
- 5 parties and their attorneys, by an institution or agency to
- 6 which custody of a minor has been transferred, and by an
- 7 individual who has been appointed guardian; with consent of the
- 8 judge, by persons having a legitimate interest in the
- 9 proceedings from the standpoint of the welfare of the minor;
- 10 and, pursuant to order of the court or the rules of court, by
- 11 persons conducting pertinent research studies, and by persons,
- 12 institutions, and agencies having a legitimate interest in the
- 13 protection, welfare, treatment, or disposition of the minor."
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 584-20, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 repealed.
- 16 ["\frac{\$584-20}{ Hearings and records; confidentiality. (a)
- 17 Notwithstanding any other law concerning public hearings and
- 18 records, any hearing or trial held under this chapter shall be
- 19 held in closed court without admittance of any person other than
- 20 those persons necessary to the action or proceeding. All papers
- 21 and records pertaining to the action or proceeding, whether part

- 1 of the permanent record of the court or of a file in the
- 2 department of health or elsewhere, shall be subject to
- 3 inspection only upon consent of the court and all interested
- 4 persons, or in exceptional cases only upon an order of the court
- 5 for good cause shown.
- 6 (b) Upon paternity being established, the confidentiality
- 7 requirement shall not extend to the judgment and all
- 8 subsequently filed documents that are used in good faith for
- 9 support and medical expenses, insurance, or enforcement
- 10 purposes, except that the confidentiality requirement shall
- 11 continue to apply to any references to a non-adjudicated alleged
- 12 or presumed father."]
- 13 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on March 15, 2094.

Requires the Judiciary to post the titles of all filings and all minutes in paternity cases to the Judiciary's website after redacting any information in which an individual has a significant privacy interest. Establishes the same confidentiality standards for paternity cases as other cases heard by the family court. Effective 3/15/2094. (SD1)
