

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§302A- Maintenance of geographically disadvantageous
5 land; expenditure of school funds; prohibited. (a)

6 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a public school shall
7 not be required by the department of education to expend any
8 school funds to maintain any geographically disadvantageous land
9 on or adjacent to its property.

10 (b) As used in this section:

11 "Geographically disadvantageous land" includes rough
12 terrain and streams.

13 "Rough terrain" means land that is uncultivated,
14 undeveloped, and unsuitable for educational purposes and that
15 may be covered by scrub or boulders.

16 "Stream" means natural, altered, or improved channels that
17 have seasonal or continuous water flows as a result of either
18 surface stormwater runoff or groundwater influx, or both.
19 Streams include channels, streambeds, stream banks, drainage
20 ways, and stream mouths."



PART II

SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for six permanent full-time equivalent (6.0 FTE) positions and funding for the Hawaii teacher standards board as follows:

- (1) \$ for one permanent full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) secretary IV position;
- (2) \$ for two permanent full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) office assistant III positions;
- (3) \$ for two permanent full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) teacher licensing specialist II positions;
- (4) \$ for one permanent full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) Hawaii teacher standard board executive officer position;
- (5) \$ for substitute teachers; and
- (6) \$ for other operation costs.

The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department of education for the purposes of this part.
