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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. The legislature finds that not only is climate  
2 change real, but it is the overriding challenge of the twenty-  
3 first century and one of the priority issues of the legislature.  
4 Climate change poses immediate and long-term threats to the  
5 State's economy, sustainability, security, and way of life.

6           The legislature recognized in Act 8, Special Session Laws  
7 of Hawaii 2005, that many quality-of-life issues, including  
8 water quality, air quality, land use, energy, and ocean  
9 resources, are important to the people of Hawaii and should be  
10 the focus for planning Hawaii's future and created the Hawaii  
11 2050 sustainability task force and Hawaii 2050 sustainability  
12 plan to coordinate the actions needed to sustain a growing and  
13 vibrant economy, while maintaining a high quality of life for  
14 all residents and visitors.

15           The legislature recognized in Act 181, Session Laws of  
16 Hawaii 2011, that the creation of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability  
17 plan comes as the State faces a growing number of pressing



1 issues, including the steady deterioration of public  
2 infrastructure, the lack of affordable housing, a continued  
3 reliance on a service-based economy, the vulnerability of Hawaii  
4 in a volatile global energy market, possible interruptions in  
5 travel and to critical food supplies, threats to fragile island  
6 ecosystems, ever-increasing numbers of residents, and an  
7 increasing number of visitors over the long-term. These issues  
8 all raise questions about the long-term limits of growth in the  
9 State and highlight the need to begin planning and acting to  
10 assure Hawaii's sustainable future.

11 A ten-year measurement update of the Hawaii 2050  
12 sustainability plan (2008-2017) was published in March 2018 by  
13 the office of the auditor with the assistance of the office of  
14 planning, which evaluated the metrics and indicators established  
15 in the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. The measurement update  
16 identified the need for funding to perform a formal ten-year  
17 update of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan.

18 The purpose of this Act is to establish a stronger policy  
19 framework for Hawaii sustainability efforts by incorporating  
20 sustainability coordination and planning into the duties and  
21 responsibilities of the office of planning.



1 SECTION 2. Chapter 226, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by adding a new section to part II to be appropriately  
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§226- Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. (a) The Hawaii  
5 2050 sustainability plan shall serve as the State's climate and  
6 sustainability action plan to determine future actions guiding  
7 the coordination and implementation of Hawaii's sustainability  
8 and climate adaptation goals, principles, and policies, and to  
9 define and implement state goals, objectives, policies, and  
10 priority guidelines using sections 226-3 to 226-27 and 226-103  
11 to 226-109, and chapter 225P, as guiding principles.

12 (b) The office of planning shall update the sustainability  
13 plan to determine future actions guiding the coordination and  
14 implementation of Hawaii's sustainability and climate adaptation  
15 goals, principles, and policies, and to define and implement  
16 state goals, objectives, policies, and priority guidelines using  
17 sections 226-3 to 226-27 and 226-103 to 226-109, and chapter  
18 225P, as guiding principles.

19 (c) The office of planning shall submit the sustainability  
20 plan updated pursuant to subsection (b) to the legislature no



1 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular  
2 session of 2021 and every tenth regular session thereafter."

3 SECTION 3. Act 8, Special Session Laws of Hawaii 2005, as  
4 amended by Act 210, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is amended by  
5 amending section 4 to read as follows:

6 "SECTION 4. **Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan.** (a) After  
7 receipt of the task force's report, the office of the auditor  
8 shall prepare the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan. The plan  
9 shall be prepared to define and implement state goals,  
10 objectives, policies, and priority guidelines using sections  
11 226-3 to 226-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, as guiding principles.  
12 The auditor shall seek input from all state departments. The  
13 auditor shall also solicit public views and concerns in  
14 preparation of the plan and shall incorporate all or a portion  
15 of the recommendations reported by the Hawaii 2050 task force.

16 The plan shall serve as a guideline for funding and  
17 implementation by state and county agencies. The office of  
18 planning shall assist the auditor in reviewing the plan.

19 (b) The auditor shall submit the sustainability plan to  
20 the legislature no later than twenty days before the convening  
21 of the regular session of 2008.

4       SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general  
5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$                    or so  
6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2019-2020 and  
7 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal  
8 year 2020-2021 for updating the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan.

9       The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of  
10 planning for the purposes of this Act.

11       SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

13       SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2100.

Hawaii 2050 Sustainability Plan; Update; Office of Planning;
