
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE ENERGY OFFICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 **PART I. GENERAL PROVISIONS**

2 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish the
3 operating budget for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 2019,
4 and ending June 30, 2021, for state executive branch programs
5 under the purview of the house of representatives standing
6 committee on energy and environmental protection.

7 SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. Unless otherwise clear from the
8 context, as used in this Act:

9 "Expending agency" means the executive department,
10 independent commission, bureau, office, board, or other
11 establishment of the state government (other than the
12 legislature, office of Hawaiian affairs, and judiciary), the
13 political subdivisions of the State, or any quasi-public
14 institution supported in whole or in part by state funds, which
15 is authorized to expend specified appropriations made by this
16 Act.



1 Abbreviations, where used to denote the expending agency or
2 a standing committee of the house of representatives, shall mean
3 the following:

4 BED Department of business, economic development, and
5 tourism

6 EEP House of representatives standing committee on energy
7 and environmental protection

8 "Means of financing" or "MOF" means the source from which
9 funds are appropriated or authorized to be expended for the
10 programs and projects specified in this Act. All appropriations
11 are followed by letter symbols. The letter symbols, where used,
12 shall have the following meanings:

13 B Special funds

14 T Trust funds

15 "Position ceiling" means the maximum number of permanent
16 and temporary full-time equivalent positions authorized for a
17 particular program during a specified period or periods, as
18 denoted by an asterisk for permanent full-time equivalent
19 positions and a pound sign for temporary full-time equivalent
20 positions.



1 "Program ID" means the unique identifier for the specific
2 program and consists of the abbreviation for the organization
3 responsible for carrying out the program followed by the
4 organization number for the program.

5 **PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

6 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATIONS. The following sums, or so much
7 thereof as may be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and
8 programs designated herein, are hereby appropriated or
9 authorized, as the case may be, from the means of financing
10 specified to the expending agencies designated for the fiscal
11 biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021. The
12 total expenditures and the number of positions in each fiscal
13 year of the biennium shall not exceed the sums and the position
14 ceilings indicated for each fiscal year, except as provided
15 elsewhere in this Act or as provided by general law.

1 **PART III. MISCELLANEOUS AND EFFECTIVE DATE**

2 SECTION 4. If any portion of this Act or its application
3 to any person, entity, or circumstance is held to be invalid for
4 any reason, then the legislature declares that the remainder of
5 the Act and each and every other provision thereof shall not be
6 affected thereby. If any portion of a specific appropriation is
7 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall
8 be expended to fulfill the objective of the appropriation to the
9 extent possible.

10 SECTION 5. If manifest clerical, typographical, or other
11 mechanical errors are found in this Act, the governor may
12 correct the errors.

13 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2100.
