
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that periodic updates to
2 the state information technology strategic plan are vital to
3 keeping abreast with ever-evolving technology and to fully
4 maximizing available modern resources to increase effectiveness,
5 efficiency, and transparency in state government. Requiring the
6 plan to be regularly refreshed will also promote continuity of
7 services regardless of changes in the State's executive
8 administration.

9 The purpose of this Act is to require the chief information
10 officer, in conjunction with the information technology steering
11 committee, to review, refresh, and submit the state information
12 technology strategic plan every four years.

13 SECTION 2. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

15 "(a) There is established within the department of
16 accounting and general services the office of enterprise



1 technology services, which shall be headed by a full-time chief
2 information officer to organize, manage, and oversee statewide
3 information technology governance. The chief information
4 officer shall be appointed by the governor as provided in
5 section 26-34. The chief information officer shall report
6 directly to the governor and, in conjunction with the
7 information technology steering committee, shall:

- 8 (1) Develop, implement, and manage statewide information
9 technology governance;
- 10 (2) Develop, implement, and manage the state information
11 technology strategic plans;
- 12 (3) Develop and implement statewide technology standards;
- 13 (4) Work with each executive branch department and agency
14 to develop and maintain its respective multi-year
15 information technology strategic and tactical plans
16 and road maps that are part of the State's overall
17 information technology strategic plans, road maps, and
18 directions;
- 19 (5) Coordinate each executive branch department and
20 agency's information technology budget request,
21 forecast, and procurement purchase to ensure



- 1 compliance with the department or agency's strategic
2 plan and road map and with the office of enterprise
3 technology services' information technology governance
4 processes and enterprise architecture policies and
5 standards, including policies and standards for
6 systems, services, hardware, software, and security
7 management;
- 8 (6) Report annually to the governor and the legislature on
9 the status and implementation of the state information
10 technology strategic plan;
- 11 (7) Review, refresh, and submit the state information
12 technology strategic plan to the governor and
13 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
14 convening of the regular session of 2021 and every
15 four years thereafter;
- 16 [~~7~~] (8) Perform other necessary or desirable functions to
17 facilitate the intent of this section;
- 18 [~~8~~] (9) Employ persons exempt from chapters 76 and 89;
- 19 [~~9~~] (10) Provide centralized computer information
20 management and processing services, coordination in
21 the use of all information processing equipment,



1 software, facilities, and services in the executive
2 branch of the State, and consultation and support
3 services in the use of information processing and
4 management technologies to improve the efficiency,
5 effectiveness, and productivity of state government
6 programs;

7 [~~(10)~~] (11) Establish, coordinate, and manage a program to
8 provide a means for public access to public
9 information and develop and operate an information
10 network in conjunction with overall plans for
11 establishing a communication backbone for state
12 government; and

13 [~~(11)~~] (12) Adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91, necessary
14 for the purposes of this part."

15 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.

Requires the Chief Information Officer, in conjunction with the Information Technology Steering Committee, to review, refresh, and submit the State Information Technology Strategic Plan to the Governor and Legislature on 2021 and every four years thereafter. (SB219 HD1)

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
