<u>SB 834</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO SOLAR ENERGY. Permits the governing body of a county to create, by ordinance, a process for the recordation and enforcement of solar easements. Allows counties to require individuals claiming a solar right to record that right by filing a declaration with the county clerk. Permits the governing body of a county to require, by ordinance, the trimming of vegetation that blocks solar radiation from solar energy devices. Authorizes the ordinance to include a designation for the cost of trimming.	AEN/PSM, WAM
<u>SB 381</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL LANDS. Requires the counties to adopt supplemental rules on condominium property regimes, including those that involve agricultural lands.	PSM/AEN, CPH
<u>SB 893</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO RECYCLING. Prohibits counties from rejecting number 1 and 2 plastic bottles presented for recycling solely because the bottles are accompanied by or adjoined to nonrecyclable bottle caps. Requires and appropriates funds for the counties to separate and appropriately dispose of such nonrecyclable bottle caps. Adds definition of "PP", or polypropylene plastic material, into integrated solid waste management law. Requires counties to include feasibility assessment of recycling PP materials.	PSM/AEN, WAM
<u>SB 940</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO AGRICULTURAL BUILDINGS. Grants county agencies the implicit right to enter property to investigate agricultural buildings and structures for violations of, and compliance with, building permit and code exemption qualifications.	PSM/AEN, JDC
