Exempts health care providers from consulting the electronic prescription accountability system when a patient is in an inpatient setting, in post-operative care, or in hospice care. Bans, beginning January 1, 2021, the import for profit, sale, and offer for sale of any cosmetic in the State, if the final product or any component of the product was developed or manufactured using animal testing performed on or after January 1, 2021.
