HB 1153, HD1
(HSCR283)
Status

RELATING TO REMOTE TESTIMONY IN LEGISLATIVE HEARINGS. LMG, FIN
Requires each house of the Legislature to establish, by rule, procedures for the public to present oral testimony at legislative committee hearings through remote testimony. Appropriates funds.

HB 1424, HD1
(HSCR281)
Status

RELATING TO VISITOR INFORMATION. LMG, FIN
Establishes a Visitor Information Center in the State Capitol. Establishes a Visitor Information Center Program to support the operations of the Visitor Information Center. Appropriates funds.

HB 1488, HD1
(HSCR534)
Status

RELATING TO THE STATE CAPITOL. LMG/JUD, FIN
Requires DAGS, in consultation with the Legislature and appropriate agencies, to develop and implement an enhanced security plan for the State Capitol. Appropriates funds to DAGS for enhanced security measures and security improvements, including vehicular barriers and to PSD to purchase or lease security screening equipment and contract private screening personnel for the State Capitol.

HB 842, HD1
(HSCR631)
Status

RELATING TO THE HAWAII STATE PLANNING ACT. LMG, FIN
Establishes a Hawaii State Planning Act Review Commission to review and make recommendations to the Legislature to update the Hawaii State Planning Act. Removes reference to achieving the viability of Hawaii's sugar and pineapple industries from the Hawaii State Planning Act's agricultural objectives. Appropriates funds.



<u>HB 1355, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR489)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN. Appropriates funds to the State Commission on the Status of Women to correct and offset one-time salary increases.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 942, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR336)</u> <u>Status</u>	MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES. Makes appropriations for claims against the State, its officers, and its employees.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 356</u> <u>(HSCR335)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE. Requires the Comptroller to annually adjust the threshold amount for which settlements for claims against the State must be approved by the legislature for inflation.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1452</u> <u>(HSCR313)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CIVIL LEGAL SERVICES. Establishes and appropriates funds for the Hawaii Legal Aid Interagency Roundtable to facilitate cooperation between various state agencies regarding civil legal services and access to justice. Appropriates funds for the Judiciary to purchase civil legal services for low- and moderate-income persons.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 627, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR757)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE. Classifies any independent expenditure as a contribution to a candidate or as a contribution to each opposing candidate. Requires any advertisement by a noncandidate committee that makes only independent expenditures to disclose all contributors for the advertisement.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1380, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR459)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE. Creates a comprehensive public funding program for candidates for county elections beginning in 2022. Appropriates funds to the Campaign Spending Commission.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1382, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR463)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE. Prohibits campaign fundraising on the property of persons that have accepted legislatively appropriated funds that exceed an aggregate value of \$100,000 or received or rendered services to the State.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1490, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR465)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CAMPAIGN FINANCE. Amends the prohibition of contributions by state and county contractors under Hawaii's campaign finance laws to include officers and board members of a contractor who enters into contracts for goods or utilities.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 162, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR592)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VIOLATIONS OF CAMPAIGN FINANCE LAW. Amends the allowable administrative fines for campaign finance violations committed by certain noncandidate committees making only independent expenditures. Prohibits the establishment of noncandidate committees that only make independent expenditures within 14 days of any election.	JUD, FIN



<u>HB 1356</u> <u>(HSCR497)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF ELECTIONS OPERATING BUDGET. Appropriates funds to the Office of Elections operating budget for the 2020 election voting contract, 2021 reapportionment, and 4 temporary positions.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 626</u> <u>(HSCR314)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VACANCIES. Requires vacancies in the offices of United States Senator, State Senator, and State Representative to be filled by special election.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1263</u> <u>(HSCR315)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ORDER OF SUCCESSION. Amends the order of succession to the office of lieutenant governor.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 709, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR341)</u> <u>Status</u>	PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE II OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII. Proposes an amendment to the Hawaii State Constitution to allow a recount of votes cast at an election to be conducted in a manner to be provided by law.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 428, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR340)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Requires an automatic recount of votes cast for a candidate or on a ballot question when the difference in the number of votes cast for the top two candidates or on the question is equal to or less than 100 votes or 0.5 percent, whichever is greater.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1248, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR755)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ELECTIONS. Enacts voting by mail uniformly across all counties for all elections commencing in 2020. Appropriates funds for the implementation and administration of the election by mail program. Requires the office of elections to submit a report to the legislature regarding the implementation of a vote by mail system.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1307</u> <u>(HSCR552)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO AN OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS. Requires the Legislative Reference Bureau to conduct a study on establishing a state central hearing agency to be known as the Office of Administrative Hearings and submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature prior to the Regular Session of 2020.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 1433, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR312)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO ADDRESS CONFIDENTIALITY. Appropriates funds for two full-time equivalent (2.0 FTE) positions, operating costs, and equipment to support the Attorney General's Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center in administering the Address Confidentiality Program.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 766, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR469)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SERVICE IN NON-CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS. Establishes a task force within the Judiciary to review allowing service of notice and process by electronic mail in civil and administrative proceedings.	JUD, FIN



<u>HB 748, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR753)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PROPERTY FORFEITURE. Prohibits civil asset forfeiture by reason of the commission of a covered offense, to the extent of the property owner's interest, unless the covered offense is a felony for which the property owner has been convicted. Prohibits the forfeiture of an animal prior to the disposition of criminal charges. Requires the Attorney General to distribute one half of all forfeited property and the sale proceeds thereof to the Hawaii law enforcement assisted diversion program, with the remaining half to be distributed to the state general fund.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 508, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR585)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DNA COLLECTION FOR CERTAIN FELONY OFFENSES. Requires persons arrested for felony sexual offenses to provide a DNA sample. Defines felony sexual offenses. Provides for the destruction of DNA samples and expungement of a DNA database profile when appropriate. Makes an appropriation for the costs of DNA collection and expungement.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 903, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR614)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY. Requires the Judiciary to establish a financial hardship task force.	JUD, FIN
<u>HB 703, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR756)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR. Prohibits any person convicted of Operating a Vehicle Under the Influence of an Intoxicant (OVUII) or Habitually Operating a Vehicle Under the Influence of an Intoxicant (HOVUII) from purchasing or publicly consuming alcohol for a probation period of following sentencing or administrative license revocation. Amends the sentencing requirements for OVUII and HOVUII offenses. Amends the threshold for HOVUII offenses.	JUD, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

- The date and time of the hearing; and


