<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO GENDER IDENTITY.
Prohibits persons licensed to provide professional counseling from engaging in or advertising gender identity change efforts. (SD1) | HLT, JUD/CPC |
| <u>SB 549, SD1</u>
<u>(SSCR761)</u>
<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO HEALTHY BEVERAGES FOR CHILDREN.
Requires restaurants that sell children's meals that include a beverage to make the default beverage a healthy beverage. Effective 1/1/2020. (SD1) | HLT, CPC |
| <u>SB 1246, SD2</u>
<u>(SSCR877)</u>
<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO TELEHEALTH.
Establishes goals for the adoption and proliferation of telehealth to increase health care access. Establishes the Strategic Telehealth Advisory Council and permanent full-time equivalent State Telehealth Coordinator position. Establishes the telehealth administrative simplification working group to research, make recommendations, and report to the legislature. Appropriates funds. Repeals 1/1/2022. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | HLT, FIN |
| <u>SB 1263, SD1</u>
<u>(SSCR766)</u>
<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE UNIFORM CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES ACT.
Updates section 329-38(i), Hawaii Revised Statutes, to be consistent with federal law under Title 21 of the Code of Federal Regulations to allow for the use of either words or figures to indicate quantity where electronic prescriptions are permitted. Updates section 329-22, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to conform Hawaii law with recent changes to the federal controlled substances law. (SD1) | HLT, JUD |
| <u>SB 813, SD2</u>
<u>(SSCR937)</u>
<u>Status</u> | RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.
Appropriates funds for operating expenses of the Department of Health, including funding for DOH general administration and attached agencies, behavioral health administration, and health resources administration. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2) | HLT, FIN |

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


PAPER: 10 copies (including an original) to Room 403 in the State Capitol;
