<u>HB 32, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR982)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO FAMILY LEAVE. Extends the deadline for the Legislative Reference Bureau to submit the sunrise analysis required by Act 109, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018, from September 1, 2019, to November 13, 2019. (HB32 HD1)	LCA, WAM

Expands the types of employee information government agencies must disclose, upon written request, to employee exclusive representatives. Establishes the public employees training program, governed by a board, to provide training to state employees. Allocates either 0.01% of each employee's gross salary, or an amount negotiated pursuant to collective bargaining, to the public employees training program. Transfers the Office of Collective Bargaining and related organizational functions, including the Chief Negotiator position, from the Office of the Governor to DHRD. Renames the Office of Collective Bargaining and Managed Competition to the Office of Collective Bargaining. (HB1008 HD1)	LCA, WAM
