
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WILDLIFE OFFENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 183D-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

3 "(b) Any person violating section 183D-66, 183D-25.5,
4 183D-26, 183D-27, 183D-32, 183D-62, or 183D-64 shall be guilty
5 of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished
6 as follows:

7 (1) For a first conviction by a mandatory fine of not less
8 than \$200, or by imprisonment of not more than one
9 year, or both[?] and all firearms, animal parts,
10 products, or items containing prohibited animal parts
11 or products involved in the commission of the
12 violations shall be considered contraband to be
13 forfeited to and disposed of by the State;

14 (2) For a second conviction within five years of a
15 previous conviction, by a mandatory fine of not less
16 than \$1,000, or by imprisonment of not more than one
17 year, or both, and all firearms, animal parts,



1 products, or items containing prohibited animal parts
 2 or products used in the commission of the violations
 3 shall be considered contraband to be forfeited to and
 4 disposed of by the State; and

5 (3) For a third or subsequent conviction within five years
 6 of the first two or more convictions, by a mandatory
 7 fine of not less than \$2,000, or by imprisonment of
 8 not more than one year, or both, and all firearms,
 9 animal parts, products, or items containing prohibited
 10 animal parts or products used in the commission of the
 11 violations shall be considered contraband to be
 12 forfeited to and disposed of by the State."

13 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
 15 begun before its effective date.

16 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
