# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SEX TRAFFICKING.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. Section 712-1202, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended as follows:

3           1. By amending subsection (1) to read:

4           "(1) A person commits the offense of sex trafficking if  
5 the person knowingly:

6           (a) Advances prostitution by compelling or inducing a  
7 person by force, threat, fraud, coercion, or  
8 intimidation to engage in prostitution, or profits  
9 from such conduct by another; or

10          (b) Advances or profits from prostitution of a minor;  
11 provided that with respect to the victim's age, the  
12 prosecution shall be required to prove only that the  
13 person committing the offense acted negligently."

14          2. By amending subsection (3) to read:

15          "(3) As used in this section:

16          "Coercion" means:



- 1        (1) Threats of serious harm to or physical restraint
- 2                against any person;
- 3        (2) Any scheme, plan, or pattern intended to cause a
- 4                person to believe that failure to perform an act would
- 5                result in serious harm to or physical restraint
- 6                against any person; or
- 7        (3) The abuse or threatened abuse of the legal process.

8        "Fraud" means making material false statements,  
9        misstatements, or omissions.

10        "Minor" means a person who is less than eighteen years of  
11        age.

12        "Threat" means any of the actions listed in section  
13        707-764(1)."

14        SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that  
15        matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were  
16        begun before its effective date.

17        SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

18        SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
