<u>SB 2431</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES. Requires and appropriates funds for the department of health to conduct comprehensive workforce and cost analysis reviews with federal partners to improve efficiency, quality, and cost-effectiveness. Appropriates funds for collective bargaining increases and other current expenses.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2617</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO EMERGENCY SERVICES. Appropriates \$700,000 to the Hawaii health systems corporation to expand the Kau Rural Health Clinic to improve access to urgent care and outpatient behavioral health services.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2618</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO AMBULANCES. Makes an appropriation to establish and fund one advanced life support ambulance based in Makalei on the island of Hawaii, including acquisition of a vehicle, equipment, and personnel costs.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2637</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO CHILDREN'S HEALTH. Requires the Department of Health to establish, implement, and evaluate a statewide program for early identification of, and intervention for, lead poisoning in infants. Requires insurers to provide coverage for the screenings.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2350</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HEALTH. Establishes a task force within the Department of Health to identify therapies and home- and community-based care services that may benefit persons having fetal alcohol spectrum disorders, including therapies and treatments that may benefit them as adults. Requires the task force to recommend any necessary policy changes, rule changes, or legislation to increase access to these therapies and services. Requires a report to the Legislature.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2224</u> Status & Testimony	RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds for structure improvements for Maui Memorial Medical Center. Requires matching private funds.	CPH, WAM

<u>SB 2535</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds to improve health care services related to cardiac care at Hilo Medical Center.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2814</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE HILO MEDICAL CENTER. Makes an appropriation for the equipment and construction of a second full-time catheterization laboratory at the Hilo medical center in the Hawaii health systems corporation east Hawaii region.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2392</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Appropriates funds for Imi Hoola student stipends or for other Imi Hoola student support programs at the discretion of the department of Native Hawaiian health of the John A. Burns school of medicine.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2542</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO THE GENERAL EXCISE TAX EXEMPTIONS. Beginning July 1, 2020, provides a general excise tax exemption for medical services by physicians and advanced practice registered nurses acting in the capacity as a primary care provider.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 2983</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO LOAN REPAYMENT FOR HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS. Appropriates funds for the health care provider loan repayment program.	CPH, WAM
<u>SB 31, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2423)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HEALTH. Revises the definition of "primary care providers" and "volunteer based supervised clinical training rotation" to improve accessibility for providers to receive income tax credits for acting as preceptors. Revises preceptor credit assurance committee. (SD1)	CPH, WAM
