<u>SB 2636, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2558)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO GENDER EQUITY. Requires publicly held domestic and foreign corporations to include certain numbers of females among their boards of directors. Authorizes administrative fines for noncompliance. (SD1)	CPH, JDC
<u>SB 2652, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2528)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO HOUSING. Amends section 201H-38 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes to clarify that the section does not require income restrictions for projects that are built for Hawaii residents, who will be owner-occupants in perpetuity, and who own no other property. (SD1)	HOU/WTL, JDC
<u>SB 2654, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2883)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO COUNTIES. Clarifies that the request for dedication for infrastructure is to connect an eligible affordable housing's infrastructure to the county's infrastructure. Authorizes a licensed private building inspector, contracted by the state or county, to certify compliance with county standards. (SD1)	HOU, JDC
<u>SB 2673, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2380)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u>	RELATING TO INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS. Establishes the right of postsecondary student athletes in intercollegiate athletics to receive compensation for the use of their name, image, or likeness. (SD1)	HRE, JDC

<p><u>SB 2836</u> <u>(SSCR2377)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE ACCESS HAWAII COMMITTEE. Gives agencies more flexibility and online options to provide enhanced digital services to the public in order to better serve the public and businesses.</p>	<p>TEC/GVO, JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 2837, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2436)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY STEERING COMMITTEE. Preserves the continuity of the information technology steering committee to properly administer section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, while redefining the composition of the committee. (SD1)</p>	<p>TEC, JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 2868, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2828)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO QUALIFIED DOMESTIC RELATIONS ORDERS. Amendments to clarify benefits to alternate payees, advisory review determinations of Hawaii Domestic Relations Orders and the priority of multiple orders. Effective date 7/1/51. (SD1)</p>	<p>LCA, JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 2894, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2479)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO CHILD CARE. Clarifies the allowable relationships the caregiver must have to be considered related to a child in care; clarifies that a program that provides exclusively for a specialized training or skill development shall be for children who are eligible pupils in grades kindergarten through twelve in public or private schools; clarifies that minimum health and safety requirements or standards as required by federal law may be imposed on any of the groups in section 346-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, that provide child care for a child whose family receives a child care subsidy from the department; clarifies that the burden of proof is upon the caregiver or facility to provide verification of meeting a declared exemption under section 346-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes; clarifies that the information that may be investigated by the department to determine violations of part VIII of chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, occurred or is occurring; clarifies that the department may file a petition for a search warrant with the district court; clarifies that a search warrant may be issued to the department and the appropriate law enforcement agency to conduct an investigation; and renumbers the exemptions to appear as they were prior to Act 276, Session Laws of Hawaii 2019. <p><u>SB 2985, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2845)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO VETERINARIANS. Provides veterinarians who provide emergency care to an animal immunity from civil liability in the absence of gross negligence. Provides veterinarians who render emergency treatment when there is no veterinarian-client-patient relationship, immunity from civil liability in the absence of gross negligence. Requires veterinarians to report to law enforcement events of animal injury, death, or abuse where there is reasonable cause to believe that it relates to dog fighting or animal abuse and gives veterinarians immunity from civil liability for making the reports. <p><u>SB 3058, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2590)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Provide a three-year extension of the sunset provision in Act 38, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017. (SD1)</p>	<p>HRE/TEC, JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 3059</u> <u>(SSCR2591)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Repeals the sunset provision in Act 39, Session Laws of Hawaii 2017.</p>	<p>HRE, JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 3075, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2606)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO PSYCHOLOGISTS. Requires the board of psychology to establish a pilot program to grant prescriptive authority to qualified psychologist applicants in counties with a population of less than 100,000 persons. Repeals on 8/31/2025. (SD1)</p>	<p>CPH, JDC</p>
<p><u>SB 3110, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2830)</u> <u>Status & Testimony</u></p>	<p>RELATING TO PROPERTY. Prohibits nonresident aliens and businesses and trusts that are significantly controlled by nonresident aliens from acquiring certain residential property in the State, except as otherwise provided by law. Effective 12/31/50. (SD1)</p>	<p>WTL, JDC</p>
