Clarifies that certain county-issued cards and certificates are not subject to the State's unfair and deceptive practices regulations related to gift certificates. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	PSM, CPH
<a href="#"><u>HB 1756, HD1</u></a> <a href="#"><u>(HSCR921-20)</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status &amp; Testimony</u></a>	RELATING TO THE STATE FIRE CODE. Amends the process for adoption of the state fire code to conform with other Hawaii state building codes. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)	PSM, JDC
<a href="#"><u>HB 2737, HD1</u></a> <a href="#"><u>(HSCR751-20)</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status &amp; Testimony</u></a>	RELATING TO FIREWORKS. Increases the fireworks display permit fee from \$110 to \$150 and the fine for certain fireworks violations from \$2,000 per violation to \$5,000 per violation. Clarifies that each aerial device, display firework, or article pyrotechnic having a total weight of 25 pounds or less that is illegally imported, transferred, or sold constitutes a separate violation. Increases the penalty for removing or extracting the pyrotechnic contents. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (HD1)	PSM, JDC/WAM
<a href="#"><u>HB 2474, HD1</u></a> <a href="#"><u>(HSCR897-20)</u></a> <a href="#"><u>Status &amp; Testimony</u></a>	RELATING TO EMERGENCY WORKERS. Amends the definition of "emergency worker" in the Penal Code to include communications dispatchers. Takes effect on 7/1/2050. (HD1)	PSM, JDC/WAM
