<u>SB 2992</u> <u>(SSCR3168)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTORCYCLES. Permanently authorizes the Department of Transportation under certain conditions to designate shoulders upon which the Department may authorize the driving of motorcycles.	TRN, JUD
<u>SB 3158, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3129)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES. Prohibits a person from intentionally or knowingly manufacturing, importing, installing, reinstalling, distributing, selling, or offering for sale any counterfeit supplemental restraint system component, nonfunctional airbag, or airbag that does not meet federal safety requirements. Prohibits a person from intentionally or knowingly selling, offering for sale, installing, or reinstalling in a motor vehicle any device that causes the motor vehicle's diagnostic systems to fail to warn that the motor vehicle is equipped with a counterfeit supplemental restraint system component or nonfunctional airbag or that no airbag is installed, as applicable. (SD1)	TRN, CPC/JUD
<u>SB 2103, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2980)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES. Authorizes the issuance of special number electric vehicle license plates to commemorate the Polynesian Voyaging Society. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 2166, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3238)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TRAFFIC SAFETY. Requires vehicles on a two-lane highway, behind which a certain number of vehicles are formed in a line, to pull over where possible to let the trailing vehicles proceed when passing is unsafe. (SD1)	TRN, JUD
<u>SB 2508, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3235)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE STATEWIDE TRAFFIC CODE. Replaces the term "accident" with collision for purposes of certain provisions of the statewide traffic code. (SD1)	TRN, JUD



<u>SB 2672</u> <u>(SSCR3270)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO CROSSWALKS. Requires a vehicle approaching a crosswalk from the opposite direction of another vehicle stopped at that crosswalk to yield and not proceed until a pedestrian, if any, has crossed the roadway.	TRN, JUD
<u>SB 2993</u> <u>(SSCR3141)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSES. Aligns the commercial driver's license qualification standards with federal regulations by repealing language related to medical waivers due to diabetes. Makes conforming amendments to Code of Federal Regulation citations.	TRN, CPC/JUD
<u>SB 2649, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR2917)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO TOUR AIRCRAFT. Amends section 261-12 to require tour aircraft operations permit applicants to have aircraft that are outfitted with FAA approved safety devices. Prohibits tour aircraft permit holders from allowing the noise footprint of their aircraft to enter any occupied property. Requires denial of permit or rescission of permit if requirements are not met. (SD1)	TRN, JUD
<u>SB 2925, SD1</u> <u>(SSCR3061)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO PAYMENT FOR AIRPORT CHARGES. Authorizes the use of debit cards and online electronic payment systems to pay for certain airport charges. Allows the airport or purchaser to pay for processing fees and charges. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)	TRN, FIN
<u>SB 2911, SD2</u> <u>(SSCR3301)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO BOATING REPORTS. Requires the fire chief and the ocean safety director of each county, in addition to the Director of Public Safety and the police chief of each county, to transmit to the Department of Land and Natural Resources a copy of every report relating to boating accidents or the theft, loss, or recovery of vessels. Requires all reports submitted pursuant to section 200-27, HRS, to be unredacted. (SD2)	TRN, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW


