A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 27-43, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) There is established within the department of
4 accounting and general services the office of enterprise
5 technology services, which shall be headed by a full-time chief
6 information officer to organize, manage, and oversee statewide
7 information technology governance. The chief information
8 officer shall be appointed by the governor as provided in
9 section 26-34. The chief information officer shall report
10 directly to the governor and shall:

11 (1) Develop, implement, and manage statewide information
12 technology governance;

13 (2) Develop, implement, and manage the state information
14 technology strategic plans;

15 (3) Develop and implement statewide technology standards;

16 (4) Work with each executive branch department and agency
17 to develop and maintain its respective multi-year



1 information technology strategic and tactical plans
2 and road maps that are part of the State's overall
3 information technology strategic plans, road maps, and
4 directions;

5 (5) Coordinate each executive branch department and
6 agency's information technology budget request,
7 forecast, and procurement purchase to ensure
8 compliance with the department or agency's strategic
9 plan and road map and with the office of enterprise
10 technology services' information technology governance
11 processes and enterprise architecture policies and
12 standards, including policies and standards for
13 systems, services, hardware, software, and security
14 management;

15 (6) Have the authority and responsibility to approve, or
16 expedite the approval process of:

17 (A) A state agency's management information system
18 project that is budgeted at or more than
19 \$1,000,000; or

20 (B) Projects the chief information officer deems
21 necessary to expedite,



1 by coordinating and focusing appropriate state
2 personnel and resources;
3 ~~(6)~~ (7) Report annually to the governor and the
4 legislature on the status and implementation of the
5 state information technology strategic plan; provided
6 that the report shall also include the status of all
7 pending and completed projects over \$1,000,000, and
8 whether the projects are on time and on budget;
9 ~~(7)~~ (8) Update the state information technology strategic
10 plan every four years;
11 ~~(8)~~ (9) Perform other necessary or desirable functions to
12 facilitate the intent of this section;
13 ~~(9)~~ (10) Employ persons exempt from chapters 76 and 89;
14 ~~(10)~~ (11) Provide centralized computer information
15 management and processing services, coordination in
16 the use of all information processing equipment,
17 software, facilities, and services in the executive
18 branch of the State, and consultation and support
19 services in the use of information processing and
20 management technologies to improve the efficiency,



1 effectiveness, and productivity of state government
2 programs;

3 ~~[(11)]~~ (12) Establish, coordinate, and manage a program to
4 provide a means for public access to public
5 information and develop and operate an information
6 network in conjunction with overall plans for
7 establishing a communication backbone for state
8 government; and


9 ~~[(12)]~~ (13) Adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91, necessary
10 for the purposes of this part."

11 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

13 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Office of Enterprise Technology Services; Management Information Systems Projects; Approval; Reports

Description:

Provides the chief information officer with the authority to approve, or expedite the approval process of, a state agency's management information system project that is budgeted at or more than \$1,000,000, or any other project the chief information officer deems necessary to expedite, by coordinating and focusing appropriate state personnel and resources. Requires the chief information officer to annually report the status of all pending or completed projects over \$1,000,000, including whether they are on time and on budget.

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
