
SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAI'I STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SCHOOL FOOD SERVICES BRANCH TO ADOPT AN ADDENDUM TO ITS AGREEMENTS FOR THE 'AINA PONO HAWAI'I STATE FARM TO SCHOOL PROGRAM REQUIRING THE PROCUREMENT OF GOODS AND/OR SERVICES FROM FOOD HUBS.

1 WHEREAS, Act 55, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, amended the
2 objectives and policies of the Hawaii State Planning Act to
3 encourage the purchase and use of Hawaii-grown food and food
4 products by residents, businesses, and governmental bodies; and
5

6 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Department of Education serves over one
7 hundred thousand nutritionally balanced, affordable meals per
8 day to over eighty-five percent of the youth in Hawaii; and
9

10 WHEREAS, The Department's School Food Services Branch
11 supports public schools statewide to ensure that their meal
12 programs comply with federal and state child nutrition
13 standards; and
14

15 WHEREAS, farm-to-school activities can improve students'
16 physical activity, academic performance, school meal
17 participation, preference for fresh fruits and vegetables, and
18 other healthy behaviors, thereby reducing the risk of chronic
19 diseases and other health conditions later in life; and
20

21 WHEREAS, farm-to school programs also can increase
22 educational opportunities and support a nutritious school
23 environment; and
24

25 WHEREAS, Act 218, Session Laws of Hawaii 2015, spearheaded
26 by the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, established a farm-to-
27 school program within the Department of Agriculture to address
28 the issues of supply, demand, procurement, and consumption of
29 Hawaii-grown foods in state facilities, primarily education



1 facilities, and take reasonable steps to incorporate more
2 agriculture and nutrition education in schools; and
3

4 WHEREAS, the Department of Education and Office of the
5 Lieutenant Governor rebranded the farm-to-school program into
6 the 'Aina Pono Hawaii state farm to school program in 2018 to
7 unite the Department of Education School Food Services Branch's
8 existing health and nutrition education programs, such as 'Aina
9 Pono Harvest of the Month, test kitchens, meal programs, menu
10 planning, and school gardens; and
11

12 WHEREAS, this farm-to-school initiative, through 'Aina Pono,
13 develops affordable and healthy menus using fresh, local foods
14 for the students attending the Kohala School Complex on the Big
15 Island and, since 2018, Mililani High, Mililani Uka Elementary,
16 and Mililani Waena Elementary schools on Oahu; and
17

18 WHEREAS, farmers in Hawaii face many challenges on their
19 way to achieving economic sustainability; and
20

21 WHEREAS, food hubs provide these small to mid-sized farmers
22 and producers, who are often unable to afford or manage trucks,
23 warehouses, processing space, and storage spaces, with
24 facilities for aggregation, storage, processing, distribution,
25 and marketing support; and
26

27 WHEREAS, supporting local farmers is essential to the
28 economic development and self-reliance of the State; and
29

30 WHEREAS, by helping local farmers become or remain
31 economically sustainable, food hubs increase local farmers'
32 ability to participate in larger agricultural markets, while
33 increasing consumers' access to fresh, locally grown food and
34 value-added products; and

36 WHEREAS, food hubs support Hawaii's rural communities and
37 present opportunities for new generations of local farmers to
38 work and live in Hawaii; and

40 WHEREAS, increasing the procurement of local agricultural
41 products for schools promotes local farmers, encourages the
42 local agriculture industry, and supports government's goal of



1 doubling local food production and improving food security for
2 the entire State; now, therefore,

3
4 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
5 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the
6 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii State
7 Department Of Education School Food Services Branch is urged to
8 adopt an addendum to its agreement for the 'Aina Pono Hawaii
9 state farm to school program requiring the procurement of goods
10 and services from food hubs; and

11
12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
13 urged to include food hubs as part of the overall procurement
14 strategy for goods and services related to the 'Aina Pono Hawaii
15 state farm to school program, however, goods and services are
16 not required to be exclusively procured from food hubs; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
19 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
20 Board of Education, Superintendent of Education, Chairperson of
21 the Board of Agriculture, Administrator for the State
22 Procurement Office, Director of the School Food Services Branch,
23 and Executive Director of the State Charter Commission.
