SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO ADOPT
ADMINISTRATIVE RULES TO STREAMLINE THE PROCESS FOR ALLOWING
TRADITIONAL HAWAIIAN FARMING SYSTEMS ON CONSERVATION LANDS.

1 WHEREAS, the State enacted Act 31, Session Laws of Hawaii
2 2015, which encouraged, as agricultural objectives of the State,
3 the growth and development of traditional Hawaiian farming
4 systems and traditional Hawaiian crops, as well as small-scale
5 farms; and

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7 WHEREAS, the rights of native Hawaiians are codified in
8 articles IX and XII of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii,
9 as well as other state laws and judicial decisions; and

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11 WHEREAS, Hawai'i's traditional farming systems, such as loko
12 i'a (fishponds), māla (cultivated gardens), and lo'i (irrigated
13 patches) were important agricultural technologies that once
14 sustained a thriving and robust island community; and

16 WHEREAS, traditional Hawaiian farming systems play a
17 critical role in Hawaii and should be encouraged to promote
18 greater self-sufficiency, crop diversity, and food security; and

20 WHEREAS, traditional Hawaiian crops like kalo, 'uala (sweet
21 potato), limu (various seaweeds), 'awa (kava), hō'i'o (large
22 native fern), and 'olena (turmeric) that were cultivated using
23 these traditional Hawaiian farming techniques continue to be
24 important agricultural products for food, medicine, and cultural
25 practices today; and

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27 WHEREAS, supporting traditional Hawaiian farming systems is
28 critical towards helping the State achieve food security and
29 increasing domestic production of a local food supply; and

1 WHEREAS, streamlining the permitting process for loko i'a,
2 traditional fishponds, has had a significant beneficial impact
3 throughout the islands; and
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5 WHEREAS, traditional farming and the native Hawaiian
6 culture generally play a vital role in preserving and advancing
7 the quality of life and cultural vitality of Hawaii; and
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9 WHEREAS, the State of Hawai'i has an affirmative obligation
10 to ensure that its regulatory actions do not adversely impact
11 the constitutionally protected rights of native Hawaiians; now,
12 therefore,
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14 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first
15 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the
16 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of Land
17 and Natural Resources is urged to adopt administrative rules to
18 streamline the process for allowing traditional Hawaiian farming
19 systems on conservation lands; and
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21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
22 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor,
23 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, Attorney
24 General, Chairperson of the Board of Trustees of the Office of
25 Hawaiian Affairs, and Chairperson of the Environmental Council.
