
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STADIUM AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The Legislature finds that due to the extreme
2 budget deficits resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic new forms
3 of generating revenue must be considered. Granting the stadium
4 authority the ability to sell the naming rights to Aloha Stadium
5 is just such an idea.

6 The legislature further finds that naming rights have the
7 potential to be a significant source of income for the stadium
8 authority. The money generated by this sale would greatly assist
9 with getting the stadium back into operating conditions, and be
10 one step closer in getting Hawaii back to normal.

11 SECTION 2. Section 109-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12 amended to read as follows:

13 "**§109-2 Stadium authority; powers and duties.** The powers
14 and duties of the stadium authority shall be as follows:

15 (1) To maintain, operate, and manage the stadium and
16 related facilities;



- 1 (2) To prescribe and collect rents, fees, and charges for
2 the use or enjoyment of the stadium or any of its
3 facilities;
- 4 (3) To make and execute contracts and other instruments
5 necessary or convenient to exercise its powers under
6 this chapter and subject to any limitations in this
7 chapter, to exercise all powers necessary, incidental,
8 or convenient to carry out and effectuate the purposes
9 and provisions of this chapter;
- 10 (4) To adopt, amend, and repeal in accordance with chapter
11 91 rules it may deem necessary to effectuate this
12 chapter and in connection with its projects,
13 operations, and facilities;
- 14 (5) To appoint a manager and a deputy manager who shall
15 have qualifications as the authority deems necessary
16 and who shall hold their respective offices at the
17 pleasure of the authority. The manager and deputy
18 manager shall be exempt from the requirements of
19 chapters 76 and 89. Effective July 1, 2005, the
20 manager shall be paid a salary not to exceed eighty-
21 seven per cent of the salary of the director of human



1 resources development. Effective July 1, 2005, the
2 deputy manager shall be paid a salary not to exceed
3 eighty-five per cent of the manager's salary. The
4 manager shall have full power to administer the
5 affairs of the stadium and related facilities, subject
6 to the direction and approval of the authority. The
7 manager shall, subject to the approval of the
8 authority, have power to appoint, suspend, and
9 discharge a secretary who shall be exempt from the
10 requirements of chapters 76 and 89, and other
11 employees, subordinates, and assistants as may be
12 necessary for the proper conduct of the business of
13 the authority. Except for persons hired on contract
14 or otherwise as provided in section 109-3 and except
15 for the manager, deputy manager, and secretary, all
16 appointments, suspensions, or discharges shall be made
17 in conformity with the applicable provisions of
18 chapter 76; and

- 19 (6) To plan, promote, and market the stadium and related
20 facilities.




1 (7) The authority may seek entities to purchase the right
2 to name the stadium and its facilities."
