# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII CIVIL RIGHTS COMMISSION TO DECLARE THAT  
THE COMMISSION DOES NOT SUPPORT DISCRIMINATION AND RIGHT OF  
ACCESS RESTRICTIONS BASED ON COVID-19 VACCINE STATUS OR  
IMMUNITY TEST RESULTS.

1           WHEREAS, any medical decision is a personal and sensitive  
2 choice; and

3  
4           WHEREAS, any person may decline an invasive medical test  
5 for health, personal, or other reasons; and

6  
7           WHEREAS, vaccines of any kind, including those formulated  
8 for the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19), are invasive  
9 medical tests; and

10  
11           WHEREAS, numerous people have suffered adverse medical  
12 effects from invasive medical tests, including vaccines; now,  
13 therefore,

14  
15           BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
16 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
17 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Civil Rights  
18 Commission is requested to declare that the Commission does not  
19 support discrimination and right of access restrictions based on  
20 COVID-19 vaccine status or immunity test results; and

22           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that no person or entity in the  
23 State should:

25           (1) Provide to, or deny, an individual any disposition,  
26 service, financial aid, or benefit that is different  
27 from, or is provided in a different manner to, a  
28 disposition, service, financial aid, or benefit  
29 provided to a similarly situated individual having a

- 4 (2) Subject an individual to segregation or separate
- 5 treatment based on the individual's COVID-19 vaccine
- 6 status or immunity test results;

- 8 (3) Restrict an individual's enjoyment of any advantage or
- 9 privilege enjoyed by others receiving a similar
- 10 disposition, service, financial aid, or benefit based
- 11 on an individual's COVID-19 vaccine status or immunity
- 12 test results;

- 14 (4) Treat an individual differently from others in
- 15 determining whether the individual satisfies any
- 16 admission, enrollment, quota, eligibility, membership,
- 17 or other requirement or condition of any disposition,
- 18 service, financial aid, function, or benefit based on
- 19 an individual's COVID-19 vaccine status or immunity
- 20 test results;

- 22 (5) Deny an individual any opportunity afforded to a
- 23 similarly situated individual having a different
- 24 COVID-19 vaccine status or immunity test result; or
- 25
- 26 (6) Afford an individual an opportunity that is different
- 27 from the opportunity afforded to a similarly situated
- 28 individual having a different COVID-19 vaccine status
- 29 or immunity test result; and

31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
 32 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant  
 33 Governor, and Executive Director of the Hawaii Civil Rights  
 34 Commission.
