## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII COMMUNITY FOUNDATION TO CONVENE A WORKING  
GROUP TO DEVELOP A PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP MODEL TO  
PREPARE FOR HAWAII'S POST-PANDEMIC RECOVERY.

1           WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted Hawaii's  
2 communities and economy in unprecedented ways; and

3  
4           WHEREAS, the complexity of the impact required an urgent  
5 response that engaged every sector of our community; and

6  
7           WHEREAS, the response required public, private, and  
8 non-profit organizations to work together to provide necessary  
9 assistance to address the complexity and wide range of responses  
10 needed across the State; and

11  
12           WHEREAS, multi-sector approaches during the pandemic led to  
13 significant and lasting results; and

14  
15           WHEREAS, as the State shifts to post-pandemic recovery and  
16 new ways to work toward a more resilient Hawaii, recovery  
17 efforts require the dedicated and thoughtful engagement of  
18 government, private sector, and non-profit partners who are  
19 steeped in experience and innovation; and

21           WHEREAS, if Hawai'i expects to solve its most difficult  
22 problems, it must commit to collaborative and long-term  
23 engagement of multiple sectors of the community to develop  
24 strategies and macro-level models that the public and private  
25 sectors can embrace; now, therefore,

27           BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
28 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session  
29 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii Community  
30 Foundation, in collaboration with the President of the Senate

1 and Speaker of the House of Representatives, is requested to  
2 convene a working group of public, private, and non-profit  
3 leaders to create a public-private partnership model to prepare  
4 for Hawaii's post-pandemic recovery; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Community Foundation  
7 and Legislative Reference Bureau are requested to provide  
8 technical and substantive resources to assist in this effort;

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Community Foundation  
12 is requested to submit a report of its findings and  
13 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the  
14 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the Regular  
15 Session of 2022; and


17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
