# SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE GOVERNOR TO ALLOW TRAVELERS ARRIVING AT POINTS WITHIN HAWAII, INCLUDING INTERISLAND TRAVELERS, TO BYPASS THE MANDATORY TEN-DAY QUARANTINE IF THEY PROVIDE PROOF THAT THEY RECEIVED BOTH DOSES OF A COVID-19 VACCINE.

1           WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic  
2 and our nation's response to it is rapidly changing and the  
3 government of the State of Hawaii has a duty to respond  
4 accordingly and present a unified, cohesive response protocol  
5 that informs the public of and protects it from the current  
6 threat level posed by COVID-19; and

8           WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention  
9 announced that individuals who have been vaccinated are no  
10 longer required to quarantine after exposure to someone with  
11 coronavirus, as long as they have received both doses of the  
12 vaccine and at least two weeks have elapsed since the second  
13 dose was administered; and

15           WHEREAS, currently, travelers arriving in Hawaii who  
16 received a negative COVID-19 test result from a trusted partner  
17 before their flight departure are allowed to bypass Hawaii's  
18 ten-day quarantine; and  
19

20           WHEREAS, presently, travelers arriving at points within the  
21 State, including interisland travelers, with documented proof  
22 that they received a COVID-19 vaccination in the required doses  
23 are not allowed to bypass the ten-day quarantine because the  
24 State has not recognized the COVID-19 vaccination as an  
25 exemption to Hawaii's ten-day quarantine; and

27           WHEREAS, easing the travel restrictions for fully  
28 vaccinated individuals by exempting them from Hawaii's ten-day  
29 quarantine provides a safe approach to reopening Hawaii's  
30 visitor industry and restoring its economy; now, therefore,

1 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-first  
2 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the  
3 House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor is urged  
4 to allow travelers arriving at points within the State,  
5 including interisland travelers, to bypass the mandatory ten-day  
6 quarantine if they provide proof that they received both doses  
7 of a COVID-19 vaccine; and

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the State is requested to make  
10 clear to travelers that other COVID-19 related protocols  
11 established by the State and counties continue to apply to  
12 arriving travelers to Hawaii, including interisland travelers,  
13 notwithstanding their vaccinations; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this  
16 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Office of the  
17 Governor.
