**Title of Bill:** SB 1287 RELATING TO THE FOOD SERVICES BRANCH.

**Purpose of Bill:** Requires the department of education food services branch to coordinate with the principals and vice principals of department schools to determine which school meal program offered by the USDA is the best fit for the student body and campus of each school.

**Department's Position:**

The Hawaii State Department of Education (Department) would like to provide comments for SB 1287.

The Department's School Food Services Branch currently consults with Complex Area Superintendents and their respective schools' leadership to determine which federal meal program offered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) best fits their schools' needs.

School food service is a critical safety net for many of our students; thus, the Department aims to take advantage of the flexibility offered by the USDA Child Nutrition Program to best meet the unique needs of each school and its student body.

The School Food Services Branch does not consider prior participation in a program as a limiting factor when assessing the implementation of a meal program.
