
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the requirement of
2 all candidates for an initial nurse license to pass a national
3 examination has resulted in the consistent practice of quality
4 health care services administered to the public. This
5 examination safeguards the quality of health care practices by
6 ensuring that each candidate possesses the minimum competencies
7 necessary for a newly-licensed, entry-level registered or
8 practical nurse to perform the job safely and effectively.
9 Despite the clear benefits of this safeguard, continuing
10 competency requirements are not currently instituted for nurse
11 licensure renewal applications in the State.

12 The legislature also finds that in today's health care
13 environment, knowledge of the latest developments in the
14 profession is a crucial means by which nursing duties are safely
15 and effectively fulfilled. New health care systems are emerging
16 and redoubling the challenge of licensure boards to assure
17 consumers that licensed nurses remain competent for the duration



1 of their practice. The legislature further finds that the most
2 efficient means to ensure patient safety is to require Hawaii-
3 licensed nurses to complete continuing competency requirements
4 prior to any application for license renewal, restoration, or
5 reinstatement.

6 The purpose of this Act is to require all non-exempt
7 licensed registered nurses and licensed practical nurses to
8 complete continuing competency requirements prior to submitting
9 an application for license renewal, restoration, or
10 reinstatement, beginning on the licensing biennium, July 1,
11 2017.

12 SECTION 2. Chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13 amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately
14 designated and to read as follows:

15 "§457- _____ Continuing competency requirements; exemptions;
16 extensions; records retention; audit. (a) Beginning July 1,
17 2017, with the renewal of the licensing biennium, and every
18 biennial renewal thereafter, each registered nurse and practical
19 nurse licensee shall have completed one of the learning activity
20 options as recognized by the board within the two-year period



1 preceding the renewal date, in addition to the requirements of
2 section 457-9.

3 (b) The following nurses shall be exempt from the
4 continuing competency requirements:

5 (1) Registered nurses licensed in this State who also
6 maintain active advanced practice registered nurse
7 licenses in accordance with this chapter and have a
8 current national certification approved by the board;

9 (2) Registered nurses and practical nurses licensed in
10 this State who also maintain current national
11 certification, approved by the board, in their
12 practice role; or

13 (3) A licensee who graduated or completed pre-licensure
14 requirements from an accredited nursing program
15 recognized by the board within twelve months prior to
16 the renewal date of the licensee's first license
17 renewal period.

18 If a licensee has graduated or completed pre-licensure
19 requirements from an accredited nursing program more than twelve
20 months but less than two years prior to the renewal date, the
21 registered nurse or practical nurse licensee shall be required



1 to obtain fifteen contact hours of learning activity options
2 recognized by the board from an approved provider, one semester
3 credit of post-licensure academic education related to nursing
4 practice from an accredited nursing program, or a learning
5 activity approved by the board prior to the first renewal
6 period.

7 (c) The board may extend the deadline for compliance with
8 the continuing competency requirements and shall consider each
9 case on an individual basis. Prior to the expiration of the
10 license, a nurse licensee may submit a written request for an
11 extension and any documentation requested by the board to
12 substantiate the reason for the extension of the continuing
13 competency requirements of this section, based on the following
14 circumstances:

15 (1) Illness, as certified by a physician or osteopathic
16 physician licensed under chapter 453 or advanced
17 practice registered nurse licensed under chapter 457
18 in the jurisdiction in which the licensee was treated;
19 or
20 (2) Military service under extended active duty with the
21 armed forces of the United States.



1 (d) Each licensee shall maintain copies of the licensee's
2 continuing competency records for the past four years or two
3 previous bienniums.

4 (e) Upon application for license renewal, restoration, or
5 reinstatement, each licensee shall have complied with and attest
6 to completion of one of the learning activity options recognized
7 by the board pursuant to subsection (a) during the two years
8 preceding the application for license renewal, restoration, or
9 reinstatement and shall be prepared to submit evidence of
10 completion if requested by the board.

11 (f) The board may conduct an audit to determine compliance
12 with the continuing competency requirement. The board shall
13 provide written notice of an audit to all licensees selected for
14 audit. Within sixty days of notification, the licensee shall
15 provide the board with documentation verifying compliance with
16 continuing competency requirements.

17 **§457- Learning activity options.** (a) The successful
18 completion of one of the following board approved learning
19 activity options shall meet the requirements for continuing
20 competency:



- 1 (1) National certification or recertification related to
2 the nurse's practice role;
- 3 (2) Thirty contact hours of continuing education
4 activities;
- 5 (3) Completion of a board-approved refresher course;
- 6 (4) Completion of a minimum of two semester credits of
7 post-licensure academic education related to nursing
8 practice from an accredited nursing program;
- 9 (5) Completion as principal or co-principal investigator
10 of a nursing research or evidence-based institution
11 review board practice project;
- 12 (6) Authoring or coauthoring a peer reviewed published
13 nursing or health-related article, book, or book
14 chapter;
- 15 (7) Developing and conducting a nursing education
16 presentation or presentations totaling a minimum of
17 five contact units that qualify to offer continuing
18 education;
- 19 (8) Completion of a board-recognized nurse residency
20 program; or



1 (9) A similar type of learning activity option; provided
2 that the type of activity shall be recognized by the
3 board."

4 SECTION 3. Section 457-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5 amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
6 inserted and to read as follows:

7 "Competency" means the ability of a nurse to integrate
8 knowledge, skills, judgment, and personal attributes to practice
9 safely and ethically in the professional nursing position and in
10 accordance with the scope of nationally recognized nursing
11 practices.

12 "Contact hour" means the same as section 16-89-2, Hawaii
13 Administrative Rules.

14 "Continuing competency" means the long-term educational and
15 professional process by which an individual undertakes and
16 documents with verifiable evidence a personal learning plan that
17 encompasses a periodic self-assessment of personal strengths and
18 weaknesses as present in the individual's practice as a nurse as
19 well as a commitment to furthering the individual's professional
20 knowledge relating to the nursing field."



1 SECTION 4. Section 457-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law,
4 the board shall have the power to deny, revoke, limit, or
5 suspend any license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or
6 as a licensed practical nurse applied for or issued by the board
7 in accordance with this chapter, and to fine or to otherwise
8 discipline a licensee for any cause authorized by law, including
9 but not limited to the following:

- 10 (1) Fraud or deceit in procuring or attempting to procure
11 a license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or
12 as a licensed practical nurse;
- 13 (2) Gross immorality;
- 14 (3) Unfitness or incompetence by reason of negligence,
15 habits, or other causes;
- 16 (4) Habitual intemperance, addiction to, or dependency on
17 alcohol or other habit-forming substances;
- 18 (5) Mental incompetence;
- 19 (6) Unprofessional conduct as defined by the board in
20 accordance with its own rules;



- 1 (7) Wilful or repeated violation of any of the provisions
2 of this chapter or any rule adopted by the board;
- 3 (8) Revocation, suspension, limitation, or other
4 disciplinary action by another state of a nursing
5 license for reasons as provided in this section;
- 6 (9) Conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise,
7 of a penal offense substantially related to the
8 qualifications, functions, or duties of a nurse,
9 notwithstanding any statutory provision to the
10 contrary;
- 11 (10) Failure to report to the board any disciplinary action
12 taken against the licensee in another jurisdiction
13 within thirty days after the disciplinary action
14 becomes final;
- 15 (11) Submitting to or filing with the board any notice,
16 statement, or other document required under this
17 chapter, which is false or untrue or contains any
18 material misstatement of fact [↗], including a false
19 attestation of compliance with continuing competency
20 requirements; or



1 (12) Violation of the conditions or limitations upon which
2 any license is issued."

3 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
