I. Background and Summary

1. A brief description of the applicant's background;

Arts and Sciences Center (ASC) is a 501(c)3 organization formed in 2003, *to provide outstanding support and infrastructure for community based learning* rooted in Puna, Hawaii. Puna communities have limited infrastructure, educational and economic opportunities. ASC originally developed in response to the need for facilities for a local charter school. The primary efforts of the organization have been focused on building infrastructure and organizational capacity dedicated to the acquisition, construction, and regulatory requirements associated with providing a place for safe, community-based education, suitable for all ages. ASC currently provides a facility equipped with 6 buildings and a modular kitchen on a 10 acre property situated adjacent to Pahoia town, off State HWY 130. The campus serves 670+ k-12 students and 90+ staff (FT and PT) of the primary tenant, Hawaii Academy of Arts and Science Public Charter School (HAASPCS). ASC also serves as a venue for various community meetings/events including our Spring *Tropical Living Festival* and Fall *Art is Life* Festival, both launched and well attended in 2016. Food, energy, entrepreneurial and workforce development are facilitated to the extend resources are available to pass through our organization.

The 2014 Lava Flow that came within a mile of our facility caused various strains on the community. ASC stayed in service and continues in spite of ongoing challenges including natural disasters and inclement weather. ASC often has over 300 people onsite and is working with the local American Red Cross to develop as additional shelter in Pahoia should it be needed. For the past two years, with the aid of grants from Hawaii County, ASC has built the capacity to hire a part time Program Specialist whose activities focus largely on programs for the general public and along with the volunteer board of ASC, on Fund Development and Organizational Capacity Building to continue serving our diverse, wide-spread community. This Grant funding request will support ASC's ability to continue providing safe learning environments and facilities in this geographically isolated, economically disadvantaged community.

2. The goals and objectives related to the request;

Goal: ASC will take actions to maintain and improve community facility infrastructure to serve community-based learning in Puna.

Objective 1: Acquire an TIAR for further development of newly acquired 14 acre parcel adjacent to existing property and facilities (total 24 acres) along Hwy 130, the section that by-passes Pahoia town.

Objective 2: Preliminary planning with 4-6 facilitated public stakeholder meetings for input and review to support all planning for community education and infrastructure. Preliminary conversations show support for shared workspaces for students and community members of all ages for STEAM project learning and **production** with labs, studios, and **workshops** and improved garden/farm structures for **food production** including **value-added products**. The planning process will greatly facilitate design, funding and development to meet immediate community needs.

3. The public purpose and need to be served;

East Hawaii communities, according to research, rank among the poorest in health status outcomes and highest health disparity rates in the state for socioeconomic risks, poverty, unemployment, household financial aid, and low birth weight rates. Additionally, research indicates that children living in this area are at risk for a number of social determinants of educational and social failure, with minimal access to healthcare services, and living within communities that have high incidence of crime, drug and alcohol abuse, violence, and child abuse and neglect. These problems may be exacerbated by a lack of employment opportunities and the unpredictable impacts such as hurricanes and lava flows. Families living in this area face challenges in accessing public services including transportation and education. ASC's capital improvement request aims to provide effective, safe facilities to educate, enrich and inspire our community to thrive.

4. Describe the target population to be served; and

According to the 2015 Hawaii County Data Book, Puna grew from 20,781 in 1990 to 45,326 in 2010, more than doubling in size in two decades. Conservatively, according to the same report, ASC serves 12,000 households in lower Puna (Puna Ma`kai). Current enrollment data of ASC's tenant HAASPCS indicates that at minimum ASC is facilitating educational service for 678 k-12 students in East Hawaii. Afterschool, evenings and weekends, several community groups regularly meet at the facility and ASC has hosted HCC Running Start and adult continuing education classes. Further, ASC's main campus serves as the office space for the faculty and administration of HAASPCS which has a nearly 5 million dollar payroll per year serving more than 90 employees. The requested Capital Improvement projects will enable ASC to continue safely and effectively serving students, faculty, staff and the community.

5. **Describe the geographic coverage.**

ASC is located in and serves Hawaii County, mainly Puna communities (2010 Census for zipcodes 96778 Pop=14,409, 96749 Pop=17,647). The community is comprised of residents living in widespread subdivisions sprawling from Kalapana, Seaview, Opi'ikau, Leilani Estates, Nanawale, Black Sands, Hawaiian Paradise Park, Orchidland Estates, Ainaloa, Hawaiian Beaches, Kapoho, Wa'awa'a, Papaya Farms Lots to Keaau & Mt.View. This area is geographically isolated, becoming more populated and remains subject to the unpredictable path of Lava. ASC works diligently to continue to provide services for this area.

Objective 2: Facilitate 4-6 public stakeholder meetings for input and review to support all planning for community education and infrastructure. Preliminary conversations show support for shared workspaces for students and community members of all ages for STEAM project learning and **production** with labs, studios, and **workshops** and improved garden/farm structures for **food production** including **value-added products**. The planning process will greatly facilitate design, funding and development to meet immediate community needs.

Objective 1: Project Manager (PM) to prepare, get approval and process an RFP to acquire a TIAR for development of 14 and 10 acre parcels. Detailed surveys of all properties are current and available.

Objective 2: Plan for facilitated design process with as many stakeholders as feasible. Schedule meetings per plan and implement as soon as feasible.

Quarter 2: Oct-Dec-

Objective 1: PM to oversee first phase of approved RFP to acquire a TIAR for development.

Objective 2: PM to facilitate design charrettes as feasible.

Quarter 3: Jan-Mar:

Objective 1: PM to oversee final phase to acquire TIAR for development.

Objective 2: PM to present preliminary design options for stakeholder review as feasible. ASC board and PM to pursue funding options for permitting and construction as plan formalizes.

Quarter 4: Apr-Jun:

Objective 1: PM to report on final TIAR.

Objective 2: ASC board and PM to pursue funding options for design, permitting and construction as plan formalizes. PM to prepare final reports.

IV. Experience and Capability

A. Necessary Skills and Experience

Since 2003, ASC has experience developing and making capital improvements to its community learning facility, valued in 2016 at \$3.96 million. ASC has maintained all the requirements for 501c3 status and has audited financial statements since 2006. ASC will use open bid and contract qualified service providers for the capital improvement projects. ASC has also managed improvements to the property with private grant funds restricted to specific projects. A long time general contractor and a retired architect are advisors to ASC.

B. Facilities

ASC received zoning changes in the form of a Special Permit to allow educational activities from the County of Hawaii Windward Planning commission and currently provides a facility equipped with 6 buildings and a modular kitchen on a 10 acre property situated adjacent to Pahoia town off of State HWY 130. Facilities include a pavilion suited for community meetings, 13 classrooms, gardens, a greenhouse, playing fields, a mac nut orchard and office space. Improving existing facilities and having a workable plan to expand are ongoing needs to serve in our community.

V. Personnel: Project Organization and Staffing

A. Proposed Staffing, Staff Qualifications, Supervision and Training

As CIP projects are funded, ASC will seek and hire a Project Manager with skills to facilitate RFPs, communicate effectively, oversee and report on assigned projects. ASC has established fiscal management practices including a contracted bookkeeper and annual external auditor. ASC has expanded capacity for project coordination with the part-time Program Specialist position. The board and staff understand and have experience with public procurement and construction project management as evidenced by our beautiful facility in Pahoa. Advisors include a licensed contractor and retired architect. ASC contracts via fair hiring processes for labor and professional services as needed to meet requirements for health and safety at our facilities.



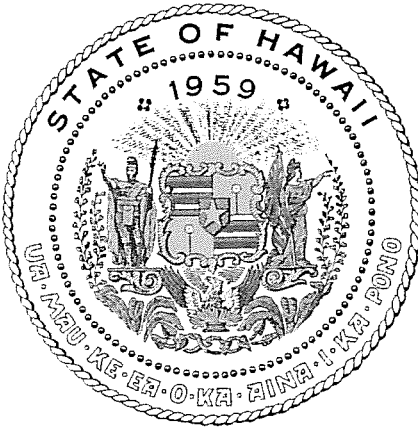

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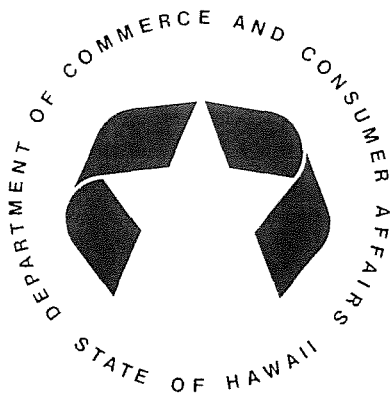
