

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§302A- Retention of student records. (a) Student
5 records may be digitized, computerized, or minified through the
6 use of scanning equipment or any other similar digitization
7 process or microfilm or any other similar photographic process;
8 provided that the method used creates an unalterable record.
9 Upon digitization, computerization, or minification, the
10 original record may be destroyed pursuant to subsection (c).

11 (b) Student records shall be retained in the original or a
12 reproduced form for a minimum of one hundred years following the
13 student's transfer, graduation, or other separation from the
14 department.

15 (c) Student records may be destroyed after the retention
16 period specified in subsection (b) or after their digitization,
17 computerization, or minification, in a manner that preserves the
18 confidentiality of the information in the record.

19 (d) As used in this section, "student records" means any
20 official student document as determined by the department and in
21 accordance with state and federal law."



1 document management systems, intended to assist state agencies
2 in modernizing their record management systems and provide
3 skills training and development for inmates. A partnership
4 between the department of education and the Hawaii correctional
5 industries program would benefit state agencies and the
6 populations they serve.

7 The purpose of this part is to authorize the department of
8 education to partner with the Hawaii correctional industries
9 program in a student records modernization pilot project and to
10 appropriate funds for this purpose.

11 SECTION 4. (a) The department of education may partner
12 with the Hawaii correctional industries program to engage in a
13 three-year student records modernization pilot project. Any
14 pilot project conducted pursuant to this section shall include:

- 15 (1) One elementary school;
16 (2) One middle or intermediate school; and
17 (3) One high school,
18 in each county.

19 (b) The department of education shall submit a report on
20 the status of any pilot project conducted pursuant to subsection
21 (a), including any findings, recommendations, and proposed



1 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
2 to the convening of each of the regular sessions of 2018, 2019,
3 and 2020.

4 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
6 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2017-2018 and
7 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
8 year 2018-2019 for a pilot project to modernize student records
9 management systems within the department of education.

10 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
11 of education for the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 6. New statutory material is underscored.

14 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
15 provided that part II of this Act shall take effect on July 1,
16 2050.
