HB 2460

RELATING TO MICROGRIDS.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Status

Authorizes the establishment of a Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawaii Authority (NELHA) microgrid demonstration project for the generation, storage, and distribution of renewable energy on property

controlled by NELHA.

HB 2431

RELATING TO ENERGY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Status

Requires the Public Utilities Commission to establish performance

incentive mechanisms for electric utilities.

HB 2029 Status

RELATING TO ENERGY EFFICIENCY.

EEP, FIN

Creates a \$50,000,000 revolving line of credit sub-fund under the umbrella of the green energy market securitization loan fund for any state agency or department to finance energy efficiency measures.

HB 2249 Status

RELATING TO ELECTRIC GRID RESILIENCY.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Establishes the grid resiliency capital investment program and the grid resiliency rebate program as well as a grid resiliency task force to prepare the State's electrical grid for natural disasters and other

emergencies.

HB 2248

RELATING TO CONSUMER PROTECTION.

EEP, CPC, FIN

Requires the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs to adopt Status

state appliance efficiency standards to protect consumers.

HB 2120 Status

RELATING TO WIND ENERGY FACILITIES.

EEP, WAL, CPC

Requires a wind energy facility owner, the owner of the land, or the department of land and natural resources to be responsible for facility

decommissioning and provides for recovery of costs.

HB 2665 Status	RELATING TO SOLAR ENERGY. Requires special permit approval for solar energy facilities larger than fifteen kilowatts on non-conforming residential subdivisions located on land with soil classified with an overall productivity rating of class D or E.	EEP, AGR/WAL, FIN
HB 2469 Status	RELATING TO CRITICAL ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE. Prohibits a county or state agency from approving a permit to construct or operate a new grid-connected electrical generation facility or storage facility in excess of one megawatt hour if it is located in a sea level rise exposure area.	EEP, CPC, FIN
HB 2712 Status	RELATING TO UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS. Requires, on or before 9/1/2018, that the department of health adopt rules for underground storage tanks and tank systems to conform with certain federal regulations and that include additional requirements for field-constructed underground storage tanks and tank systems.	EEP, HHS, FIN
HB 2723 Status	RELATING TO PRESERVING CORAL REEFS. Prohibits the sale of sunscreen containing oxybenzone, unless the sunscreen is a prescription drug. Effective 1/1/2023.	EEP, CPC, FIN
HB 2264 Status	RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT. Prohibits the sale, offer for sale, or distribution for sale of non- prescription SPF sunscreen products containing octinoxate or oxybenzone.	EEP, CPC, FIN
HB 2612 Status	RELATING TO THE ENVIRONMENT. Directs the Department of Health to conduct a statewide study of sewage contamination in nearshore marine areas. Appropriates moneys.	EEP, HHS, FIN
HB 2547 Status	RELATING TO SUSTAINABILITY. Establishes the Hawaii Sustainability Act, including the Office of Sustainability and the State Sustainability Fund.	EEP, EDB, FIN

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW
