from 2030 to 2045.

Amends the cesspool upgrade, conversion, or connection income tax credit pilot program by repealing the provision that restricts DOH from

certifying more than two residential large capacity cesspools as

qualified cesspools.

RELATING TO RESOURCE CONSERVATION.

EEP, CPC

Requires the PUC to adopt rules adopting federal energy efficiency and water conservation standards. Makes the rules effective if the federal

government repeals current federal energy efficiency and water

conservation standards.
