
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 103D-707, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "**§103D-707 Remedies after an award.** If after an award it
4 is determined that a solicitation or award of a contract is in
5 violation of law, then:

6 (1) If the person awarded the contract has not acted
7 fraudulently or in bad faith:

8 (A) The contract may be ratified and affirmed, or
9 modified; provided that it is determined that
10 doing so is in the best interests of the State;

12 (B) The contract may be rescinded and awarded to the
13 next lowest responsive, responsible bidder to
14 whom the contract would have been awarded were it
15 not for the violation of law, as applicable or as
16 directed by the office of administrative hearing;

1 ~~(B)~~ (C) The contract may be terminated and the
2 person awarded the contract shall be compensated
3 for the actual expenses, other than attorney's
4 fees, reasonably incurred under the contract,
5 plus a reasonable profit, with such expenses and
6 profit calculated not for the entire term of the
7 contract but only to the point of termination; or

8 (2) If the person awarded the contract has acted
9 fraudulently or in bad faith:

10 (A) The contract may be declared null and void; or

11 (B) The contract may be ratified and affirmed, or
12 modified, if the action is in the best interests
13 of the State, without prejudice to the State's
14 rights to such damages as may be appropriate."

15 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.

Government Contracts; Procurement; Protests; Contract Solicitations

Description:

Authorizes, where it is determined that a solicitation or award of a contract is in violation of law, the government contract to be rescinded and awarded to the next lowest responsive, responsible bidder to whom the contract would have been awarded were it not for the violation of law, as applicable or as directed by the office of administrative hearings. Effective 7/1/2112. (HD1)

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
