A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COMMERCIAL SEXUAL EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that children in the
 State are vulnerable to sex trafficking and commercial sexual
- ${f 3}$ exploitation. Foster children and runaways with histories of
- 4 abuse and neglect are at particularly high risk. LGBTQ+ youth,
- 5 immigrants, undocumented workers, and young people suffering
- 6 from mental illnesses and substance abuse issues are also highly
- 7 vulnerable. Victims are often lured into sex trafficking
- 8 through emotional manipulation and control, force, fraud, or
- ${f 9}$ threats. Sexually exploited children most often do not have the
- 10 ability or resources to escape their traffickers and start new
- 11 lives.
- 12 The legislature recognizes that, over the past decade, the
- 13 commercial sexual exploitation of children has garnered greater
- 14 attention in Hawaii and throughout the United States. Due to
- 15 reporting requirements under federal and state law, the
- 16 department of human services has received an increasing number
- 17 of hotline calls from witnesses or victims of child sex

- 1 trafficking. However, because child sex trafficking is covert,
- 2 it is difficult to accurately measure the scope of the problem,
- 3 and exploited youth may not identify themselves as victims.
- 4 The legislature believes that the statewide human
- 5 trafficking coordinator, a position established within the
- 6 department of the attorney general in May 2020, plays a vital
- 7 function in the department's multidisciplinary approach to
- 8 improving the State's anti-trafficking response.
- 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require the
- 10 department of the attorney general to provide annual reports to
- 11 the legislature on available data pertaining to the commercial
- 12 sexual exploitation of children.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 28, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 14 by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately designated
- 15 and to read as follows:
- 16 "§28- Commercial sexual exploitation of children;
- 17 annual report. (a) No later than twenty days prior to the
- 18 convening of each regular session, the department of the
- 19 attorney general shall submit a report to the legislature
- 20 containing available data from entities that collect and are
- 21 willing to provide data pertaining to the commercial sexual

12		<u>(B)</u>	Demographic information including gender, age,
13			race, and ethnicity for children who are
14			suspected victims or confirmed victims of
15			commercial sexual exploitation of children;
16		(C)	The number of runaways and revictimizations;
17		<u>(D)</u>	The number of children currently receiving each
18			type of service; and
19		(E)	The total number of children newly served by
20			these providers during the fiscal year;

1	<u>(5)</u>	The number of arrests by law enforcement agencies,
2		open or pending prosecutions, and convictions obtained
3		in the State, delineated by county, for crimes
4		relating to the commercial sexual exploitation of
5		<pre>children;</pre>
6	(6)	The identification of any gaps in the State's ability
7		to collect relevant data; and
8	(7)	Recommendations for improving data collection and data
9		sharing among service providers, non-governmental
10		organizations, and government agencies, including law
11		enforcement agencies.
12	(b)	Every public official and every state and county
13	departmen	t or agency, as applicable, shall:
14	(1)	Share information with and provide all necessary
15		assistance and cooperation to the department of the
16		attorney general within the jurisdictional authority
17		of the respective official, department, or agency; and
18	(2)	Assist the department of the attorney general in
19		carrying out its duties under this section.
20	(c)	Entities are encouraged but not required to collect
21	specific	data for the report pursuant to this section.

1	(d) As used in this section:						
2	"Child" means a person under eighteen years of age.						
3	"Commercial sexual exploitation of children" means any						
4	sexual activity involving a child for the exchange or promise of						
5	anything of value by any person.						
6	"Confirmed victim" means a child who has been identified by						
7	a state-approved validated assessment tool as a victim of sex						
8	trafficking or severe forms of trafficking in persons as defined						
9	in section 350-1.						
10	"Department" means the department of the attorney general.						
11	"Suspected victim" means a child who is reasonably believed						
12	to be a victim of sex trafficking or severe forms of trafficking						
13	in persons as defined under section 350-1, but who has not been						
14	identified as a confirmed victim."						
15	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general						
16	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so						
17	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for						
18	the department of the attorney general to fulfill the annual						
19	reporting requirements of this Act.						
20	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of						
21	the attorney general for the purposes of this Act.
