

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that under existing law,
- 2 a person older than seventy-two years of age must renew their
- 3 driver's license every two years. The department of
- 4 transportation reported that they have not found local data that
- 5 indicates drivers between the ages of seventy-two and
- 6 seventy-nine are at higher risk of causing or being involved in
- 7 crashes. The legislature further finds that according to a
- 8 study conducted by the American Automobile Association, only
- 9 twenty-one jurisdictions in the United States have a shorter
- 10 renewal cycle based on the age of the driver. Additionally, of
- 11 those jurisdictions that have age-based license renewal
- 12 policies, most of the renewal cycles are four years or longer.
- 13 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to extend the
- 14 expiration date of a driver's license for a licensee who is
- 15 seventy-two years of age or older from two years to four years.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:

1	"\$286-106 Expiration of licenses. Every driver's license
2	issued under this part, except for a provisional license issued
3	under section 286-102.6, which shall expire on the date of the
4	provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday, whether an original
5	issuance or a renewal, shall expire on the first birthday of the
6	licensee occurring $[not]$ <u>no</u> less than eight years after the date
7	of the issuance of the license, unless sooner revoked or
8	suspended; provided that:
9	(1) The license shall expire on the first birthday of the
10	licensee occurring $[not]$ no less than four years after
11	the date of the issuance if, at the time, the licensee
12	is [twenty-four]:
13	(A) Twenty-four years of age or younger; or
14	(B) Seventy-two years of age or older; and
15	[(2) The license shall expire on the first birthday of the
16	licensee occurring not less than two years after the
17	date of the issuance of the license if, at that time,
18	the licensee is seventy-two years of age or older; and
19	$\frac{(3)}{(2)}$ If the licensee is a legal immigrant, the license
20	shall expire no later than the licensee's authorized
21	period of stay in the United States.

- 1 The examiner of drivers may issue a license for a shorter
- 2 period if the licensee has a physical condition or conditions
- 3 that the examiner of drivers reasonably believes may impair the
- 4 driver's ability to drive."
- 5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
