A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that prioritizing the
- 2 State's natural resources is an essential component of
- 3 destination management. Prior to 2020, arrivals to the State
- 4 exceeded ten million visitors, and according to state
- 5 economists, by 2025, Hawaii will again return to pre-pandemic
- 6 tourism levels. The legislature believes that rising visitor
- 7 numbers in Hawaii's state parks could be better managed using a
- 8 visitor reservation system.
- 9 The legislature notes that, in 2018, massive flooding on
- 10 Kauai damaged surrounding bridges, beaches, and roads, forcing
- 11 Haena state park to close for fourteen months. When the park
- 12 reopened, the department of land and natural resources worked
- 13 with the local community to implement a reservation system that
- 14 allows a maximum of nine hundred park visitors per day.
- 15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 16 (1) Appropriate moneys for the department of land and
- 17 natural resources to establish twenty-eight full-time

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1	equivalent positions to allow the department to work
2	with the legislature to replicate the reservation
3	model created at Haena state park; and
4	(2) Appropriate additional moneys from the state parks
5	special fund for purposes of state park management.
6	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,274,160 or so much
8	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 to
9	establish twenty-eight full-time equivalent (28.0 FTE) positions
10	in parks administration and operation (LNR 806) to implement
11	visitor reservation systems in Hawaii state parks.
12	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
13	land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
14	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the state parks
15	special fund the sum of \$11,908,688 or so much thereof as may be
16	necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for the management of
17	Hawaii's state parks.
18	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
19	land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
20	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
