# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INDIVIDUAL SPORTS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that home-schooled
2	students are part of the diverse fabric that make up our
3	educational system in Hawaii. In 2016, nearly three thousand
4	students in Hawaii were home-schooled. Parents who choose to
5	home-school their children are responsible for their child's
6	total educational program, including athletics and other
7	extracurricular activities. Under Hawaii law, home-schooled
8	students do not have the right to participate in public school
9	activities, including sports. Although individual schools and
10	complex areas have the authority to allow home-schooled students
11	to participate in its activities, policies across the various
12	complex areas can vary.
13	It is imperative for the State to ensure that all home-
14	schooled students have equitable opportunities to succeed,
15	including through athletic participation. Allowing home-
16	schooled, high school-age students to participate in individual

7	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
8	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
9	and to re	ad as follows:	
10	" <u>§</u> 30	2A- Home-schooled students; individual sports;	
11	participa	tion. (a) Every high school student in the ninth,	
12	tenth, el	eventh, or twelfth grade who:	
13	(1)	Is home-schooled in accordance with section 302A-1132;	
14		and	
15	(2)	Meets the participation requirements and restrictions	
16		for an individual sport, including maintaining	
17		appropriate grade point averages, paying appropriate	
18		fees, and signing a release and express assumption of	
19		risk waiver; provided that the requirements or	
20		restrictions of the release shall not be inconsistent	
21		with this section;	

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- 1 shall be allowed to participate as an unattached competitor in
- 2 any individual sport at athletic events sanctioned by an
- 3 educational athletic organization and available to the public
- 4 school that the student would otherwise be required to attend.
- 5 (b) The department may adopt rules to effectuate this
- 6 section and provide procedures by which an eligible student may
- 7 apply to participate in individual sports.
- 8 (c) As used in this section, "individual sport" means a
- 9 school-authorized sport that does not require team
- 10 participation, including but not limited to air riflery,
- 11 bowling, cross country, diving, esports, golf, judo, swimming,
- 12 tennis, track and field, and wrestling."
- 13 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2051.
