
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO CALL A CONVENTION FOR PROPOSING AMENDMENTS PURSUANT TO ARTICLE V OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION LIMITED TO PROPOSING AMENDMENTS THAT IMPOSE FISCAL RESTRAINTS ON THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, LIMIT THE POWER AND JURISDICTION OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, AND LIMIT THE TERMS OF OFFICE FOR ITS OFFICIALS AND FOR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.

1 WHEREAS, Executive Orders by the President of the United
2 States have become a vehicle through which the President may
3 overstep the limits of the President's constitutional authority;
4 and

5
6 WHEREAS, the concentration of power at the federal level
7 has had the effect of making federal officials less responsive
8 to the will of the people and more readily influenced by
9 lobbyists, wealthy corporations, and special interests in
10 Washington, D.C.; and

11
12 WHEREAS, much of the federal law is now enacted by federal
13 bureaucrats who were never chosen by the people and have no
14 accountability to the people whatsoever; and

15
16 WHEREAS, policy decisions made at the state level tend to
17 be more responsive to the needs and desires of the people; and

18
19 WHEREAS, the federal government has created a crushing
20 national debt through improper and imprudent spending; and

21
22 WHEREAS, Hawaii has historically used federal funds for
23 economic development that are subject to federal fiscal
24 restraints; and

25
26 WHEREAS, the federal government has invaded the legitimate
27 roles of the states through the manipulative process of federal
28 mandates, many of which are unfunded to a great extent; and

2 WHEREAS, the states have the ability to restore the
3 responsiveness of government to the people and to restrain
4 abuses of federal power by proposing amendments to the
5 Constitution of the United States through a limited convention
6 of the states under article V; now, therefore,

8 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
9 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session
10 of 2022, the Senate concurring, that this body urges and applies
11 to Congress under the provisions of article V of the
12 Constitution of the United States for the calling of a
13 convention of the states, limited to proposing amendments to the
14 Constitution of the United States that impose fiscal restraints
15 on the federal government, limit the power and jurisdiction of
16 the federal government, and limit the terms of office for its
17 officials and for members of Congress; subject, however, to the
18 following reservations, understandings, and declarations:
19

- 20 (1) An application to the Congress of the United States to
21 call an amendment convention of the states pursuant to
22 article V of the United States Constitution confers no
23 power to Congress other than the power to call such a
24 convention. The power of Congress to exercise this
25 ministerial duty consists solely of the authority to
26 name a reasonable time and place for the initial
27 meeting of a convention;
28
- 29 (2) Congress shall perform its ministerial duty of calling
30 an amendment convention of the states only upon the
31 receipt of applications for an amendment convention
32 for substantially the same purpose as this application
33 from two-thirds of the legislatures of the several
34 states;
35
- 36 (3) Congress shall not have the power or authority to
37 determine any rules for the governing of an amendment
38 convention of the states pursuant to article V of the
39 United States Constitution. Congress does not have
40 the power to set the number of delegates sent by any
41 state to such a convention, nor does it have the power
42 to name delegates to such a convention. The power to

1 name delegates remains exclusively within the
2 authority of the legislatures of the several states;

3
4 (4) By definition, an amendment convention of the states
5 means that states shall vote on the basis of one
6 state, one vote;

7
8 (5) A convention of the states convened pursuant to this
9 application shall be limited to consideration of the
10 topics specified herein and no other. This
11 application is made with the express understanding
12 that an amendment that in any way seeks to amend,
13 modify, or repeal any provision of the Bill of Rights
14 shall not be authorized for consideration at any
15 stage. This application shall be void *ab initio* if
16 ever used at any stage to consider any change to any
17 provision of the Bill of Rights;

18
19 (6) Pursuant to article V of the United States
20 Constitution, Congress may determine whether proposed
21 amendments shall be ratified by the legislatures of
22 the several states or by special state ratification
23 conventions. The Legislature of the State of Hawaii
24 recommends that Congress select ratification by the
25 legislatures of the several states; and

26
27 (7) The Legislature of the State of Hawaii may provide
28 further instructions to its delegates and may recall
29 its delegates at any time for a breach of duty or a
30 violation of the instructions provided; and

31
32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this application constitutes a
33 continuing application in accordance with article V of the
34 Constitution of the United States until the legislatures of at
35 least two-thirds of the several states have made applications on
36 the same subject; and

37
38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business,
39 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to conduct a
40 study of the potential impacts of federal fiscal restraints on
41 Hawaii's economy and report its findings and recommendations to



1 the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
2 of the Regular Session of 2023; and

3
4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
5 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader and
6 Secretary of the United States Senate, Speaker and Clerk of the
7 United States House of Representatives, presiding officers of
8 each of the legislative houses in each of the other forty-nine
9 states, and Department of Business, Economic Development, and
10 Tourism.
