HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

CONVENING A WORKING GROUP TO DETERMINE ANY CIRCUMSTANCES UNDER WHICH GOVERNMENT ENTITIES SHOULD BE REIMBURSED FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE SERVICES ON LAND FOR TRAIL USERS AND WHAT CONSTITUTES PROPER PUBLIC NOTICE OF A TRAIL USER'S ILLEGAL PRESENCE ON LAND FOR PURPOSES OF IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF LAW.

WHEREAS, certain areas within the numerous hiking trails available to the public throughout the State pose safety concerns and consequently have been closed to the public; and

WHEREAS, despite warnings, some individuals and groups unlawfully enter trails that have been closed to the public due to safety concerns, ultimately putting themselves at risk of significant injury and risking damage to native habitats and other natural resources that may be in those closed areas for preservation purposes; and

WHEREAS, those defying the law by entering into prohibited areas not only put themselves at risk, but also create potentially difficult and expensive rescue operations that put their rescuers' safety and lives at risk; and

WHEREAS, because of the considerable costs associated with the search and rescue of individuals who willfully disregard their and others' safety by ignoring warning signs, it is critical to develop policies that encourage public safety and accountability; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2022, the Senate concurring, that a working group is convened to determine any circumstances under which government entities should be reimbursed for search and rescue services on land for

whether the trail user's presence on a section of land was illegal;

(2) The feasibility and advisability of creating and posting a list of legal hikes in the State, along with maps and descriptions of those legal hikes, on an appropriate county or state website;

(3) Sufficient public notice requirements to inform the public which sections of land in the State are legal hiking areas and under what conditions and whether the list of legal hikes described in paragraph (2), if posted on the appropriate county or state website in lieu of signage posted on the subject land, can suffice as proper public notice of the illegality of a trail user's presence on a section of land for purposes of imposing penalties on the trail user for any violations of law;

(4) Other options for giving reasonable proper notice of legal and illegal hikes; and

(5) Other appropriate issues, concerns, and considerations discussed by the working group; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that based on its findings and determinations, the working group is requested to make recommendations and propose any legislation that may be necessary to effectuate those recommendations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested to submit its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2023; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Acting Attorney General; Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources; Director of Health; the respective fire chiefs of the City and County of Honolulu and the Counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui; the respective police chiefs of the City and County of Honolulu and the Counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui; the respective
