A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A FOOD HUB PILOT PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's food
- 2 security may be strengthened by growing more food locally and
- 3 increasing access to local food. This endeavor may be supported
- 4 by establishing food hubs, which are centrally located
- 5 facilities having a business management structure that
- 6 facilitates aggregation, storage, processing, distribution, and
- 7 marketing of locally produced food products. By actively
- 8 coordinating these activities along the value chain, food hubs
- 9 may provide wider access to institutional and retail markets for
- 10 small- to mid-sized producers and increase consumer access to
- 11 fresh healthy food, including those consumers in underserved
- 12 areas and food deserts.
- 13 The legislature also finds that food hubs encounter
- 14 financial obstacles when seeking to launch or expand their
- 15 operations. Therefore, a funding source is needed to support
- 16 the establishment and growth of food hubs on a scale that meets

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- 1 demand by state institutions such as schools, hospitals, and
- 2 correctional facilities.
- 3 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 4 five-year food hub pilot program under the department of
- 5 agriculture and appropriate funds for the program and upgrades
- $\mathbf{6}$ to the Honalo marshalling yard to be developed as a food hub.
- 7 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a five-year food hub
- 8 pilot program, which shall be administered by the department of
- 9 agriculture.
- 10 (b) The food hub pilot program shall:
- 11 (1) Adopt the United States Department of Agriculture's
- 12 working definition of "food hub", which means "a
- centrally located facility with a business management
- 14 structure facilitating the aggregation, storage,
- processing, distribution, and/or marketing of
- 16 locally/regionally produced food products"; and
- 17 (2) Award grant funding to qualified applicants for the
- 18 construction of critical infrastructure to establish
- 19 and expand food hubs in each of the counties,
- 20 including:

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1		(A)	Construction or improvement of facilities for
2			aggregation, washing, minimal processing,
3			packaging, cold storage, and other
4			value-additions; and
5		(B)	Provision of technical assistance to develop
6			in-state capacity to supply state institutions
7			and other markets.
8	(c)	The	department of agriculture shall establish criteria
9	for the av	ward	of initial start-up grant funding or subsequent
10	expansion	fund	ing under the food hub pilot program, including
11	the follow	wing	provisions:
12	(1)	Prio	rity shall be given to organizations having
13		demo	nstrated experience in aggregation, washing,
14		mini	mal processing, packaging, cold storage, and other
15		valu	e-additions for delivering local produce to local
16		mark	ets;
17	(2)	Qual	ifying applicants shall include corporations,
18		limi	ted liability companies, partnerships, sole
19		prop	rietorships, non-profit organizations, and
20		agri	cultural cooperatives that meet necessary

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1		insurance requirements and provide a certificate of			
2		vendor compliance with Hawaii compliance express;			
3	(3)	Applicants seeking to establish a new food hub where			
4		none currently exist shall first secure a physical			
5		location for the food hub and draft a detailed plan			
6		for the food hub's operation, including activities in			
7		which the applicant intends to engage, such as serving			
8		as a marketplace for buying and selling, or providing			
9		certified kitchen space in which multiple farmers may			
10		share use of facilities for value-added product			
11		development; and			
12	(4)	Applicants shall explain their intended actions to			
13		increase access to locally produced food.			
14	(d)	The department of agriculture shall require that the			
15	receipt o	f grant funding pursuant to the food hub pilot program			
16	be conditioned upon the recipient's compliance with all				
17	applicable state and federal food safety laws, rules, and				
18	regulations, including the FDA Food Safety Modernization Act,				

P.L. 111-353, and that Act's provisions on supplier

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- 1 (e) The department of agriculture shall adopt rules
- 2 pursuant to chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for the
- 3 administration and operation of the food hub pilot program.
- 4 (f) The food hub pilot program under this section shall
- 5 terminate on June 30, 2027.
- 6 SECTION 3. (a) The department of agriculture shall submit
- 7 interim reports on:
- 8 (1) The department's progress in implementing this Act;
- 9 (2) Preliminary results of the food hub pilot program; and
- 10 (3) The department's findings and recommendations,
- including any proposed legislation,
- 12 to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
- 13 convening of the regular sessions of 2023, 2024, 2025, and 2026.
- 14 (b) The department of agriculture shall submit a final
- 15 report of its findings and recommendations, including any
- 16 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty
- 17 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2027. The
- 18 report shall include the results of the food hub pilot program
- 19 and a recommendation as to whether the program should be made
- 20 permanent, with or without modifications.

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- 1 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2022-2023 for
- 4 the establishment of a five-year food hub pilot program,
- 5 including the awarding of grant moneys to qualifying food hubs.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 5. The director of finance is authorized to issue
- **9** general obligation bonds in the sum of \$ or so much
- 10 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
- 11 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2022-2023
- 12 for the purpose of completing critical infrastructure upgrades
- 13 to enable the Honalo marshalling yard to be developed as a food
- 14 hub consistent with the purposes of this Act.
- 15 The sum appropriated for this capital improvement project
- 16 shall be expended by the department of agriculture for the
- 17 purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 6. The appropriation made for the capital
- 19 improvement project authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
- 20 the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is

- 1 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation
- 2 unencumbered as of June 30, 2024, shall lapse as of that date.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Report Title:

Department of Agriculture; Food Hub Pilot Program; Grant Funding; Honalo Marshalling Yard; Appropriation

Description:

Requires the department of agriculture to establish a five-year food hub pilot program to increase access to local food. Provides for the award of grant funding to qualified applicants wishing to establish or expand a food hub or provide certain technical assistance. Authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds for the Honalo marshalling yard. Requires reports to the legislature. Appropriates funds. Effective 7/1/2050. (HD1)

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
