OVERVIEW

<u>Mission Statement:</u> The Hawaii State Public Library System (HSPLS) nurtures a lifelong love of reading and learning through its staff, collections, programs, services and physical and virtual spaces.

State-wide Conditions Affecting Operations:

The following issues have significantly impacted our operations this past year:

State-wide health and safety protocols

The pandemic and ever-changing environmental conditions have impacted our ability to provide services. Specifically, the additional processes that staff have had to implement to serve the public safely have impacted daily operations. Since the start of the pandemic, staff have had to implement varying health and safety processes, from quarantining and disinfecting books to enforcing mask mandates and checking for vaccination status at the door to allow entry. While these are important protective measures, day-to-day operations and services slow down as staff have to deal with patrons who do not agree with the various requirements.

State-wide processes for hiring

HSPLS has been challenged with a large number of unfilled positions due to retirements, pandemic moves, loss of staff, hiring freezes, suspension of hiring due to Reductions in Force, and 69 frozen positions. On Hawaii Island, we had five (of twelve) branch manager vacancies at once and not enough staff to maintain continuous services for all of our communities. Although we have made a concerted effort since the beginning of FY22, the current state processes for hiring can take up to six months or more to complete the entire process. Many times, even after completing the process, we do not have any candidates who accept the job.

Budget restrictions

Each year we have been restricted from using 5-10% of our budget. The HSPLS budget is simple. Eighty percent of the budget is for staffing and the remaining twenty percent is for current expenses (i.e. utilities, maintenance, supplies, purchasing books) to operate 51 branch libraries, two administrative office spaces and one delivery logistics operational space.

In FY22, the budget restriction meant that we had \$2,308,306 less for staffing and operations. While we can request the release of funds months after the fiscal year starts, not having access to the funds at the start of the fiscal year creates a lot of uncertainty, directly impacting our ability to start the hiring process in a timely manner to keep our branches open. In most years, we did not receive all of the funds that had been budgeted; sometimes the funding is released so late that we are unable to expend the funds to hire staff, making it very difficult to fill vacancies.

<u>Federal Funds:</u> HSPLS receives approximately \$1.3 million through its only source of federal funds, the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA), provided by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). The Grants to States program is a portion of LSTA funding that is distributed to all states based on a population formula; it requires a Maintenance of Effort agreement and matching general funds on the part of the State.

HSPLS relies on general funds to meet these requirements, and any reduction in our budget directly reduces the amount of federal funds Hawaii receives. LSTA funds directly support our technology, connectivity, integrated library system, and online database subscriptions for the public. All of these services are vital to maintaining library operations and access to resources for Hawaii's communities.

In the most recent reauthorization of the Museum and Library Services Act (MLSA), the language for the formula for the Grants to States program was changed. The base amount was increased from \$680,000 to \$1M if/when the funding is allocated. Efforts are being made to increase the funding for this program so that the new base can be implemented. A small increase was made in the most recent federal budget that was passed in December 2021, which means Hawaii should receive more funding in future grant allocations. It also means there could be a required increase in our Maintenance of Effort and matching fund requirements. We are still waiting for more information from IMLS regarding the amount of funding and the impact on our requirements to receive the funding.

In FY22, HSPLS also received an additional \$2,306,567.00 in ARPA funding through the IMLS. The terms of this funding requires that all funds must be encumbered or spent by September 30, 2022. Additionally, the funding must be used to support communities in pandemic recovery related to technology and internet access, support of public health protocols in libraries, supporting library services, and outreach. We are focusing this funding toward the upgrade our technology devices statewide for public access, and digital literacy to support education, health and workforce development needs.

Budget Request:

The process we use to develop and prioritize our budget requests is based on a review of our prior budget and actual expenditures for previous years. We take that data and review it against the priorities we have for people, place, collections and services/programs. Areas of greatest need and potential impact on our ability to provide public library services to our communities are

carefully balanced. Lastly, we then consider how the budget request corresponds with our long-term priorities of evolving our services to meet the ever-changing needs of our communities.

HSPLS' FY2023 supplemental budget requests include the following (see attachment A):

- 1. \$130,000 for Student Helpers. This funding will support the increased cost for 200 student helpers across our 51branches to provide vital staffing support in shelving millions of items, processing materials, and programming.
- 2. \$1,000,000 for Security Guards and Security Systems for 11 libraries. Additional funds are needed to provide a higher level security at our libraries and to install monitored security systems at 11 libraries that have seen an increase in violence and destructive behavior around the facilities.
- 3. \$750,000 for Library Materials. Additional funds will increase the general fund base budget for books and library materials for 51 branches to \$1,500,000. The funding supports the purchase of physical and digital collections for the reading and learning needs of our communities.
- 4. \$100,000 for van for Hawaii and addition of lifts to vans on neighbor islands. An additional van is needed on Hawaii Island to support the work of our traveling janitor and provide additional delivery of material services. In order to support the health and efficiencies of our delivery drivers, we need to add lifts to the back of our delivery vans on the neighbor islands.

In order to ensure we are taking care of our building assets and community spaces, we are requesting the following in Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) funding:

Lump-sum Health & Safety CIP Funding of \$10,000,000 for FY 2023. (See Attachment B) The requested amount will address our backlog of Health and Safety projects and energy efficiency projects. The requested funding will ensure that projects that are already in progress will be able to proceed forward without delay due to lack of funding.

Our libraries are important community spaces that not only serve as vital places for reading, learning, using technology, and gathering, but often times the only cool space for people to go to escape the increasing heat from climate change. Sixty-percent of our 51 buildings were built

before the 1970s, and continual investment is required to ensure that our libraries are healthy, safe, energy efficient, and comfortable community spaces.

Public libraries are more important than ever as we seek to recover and be resilient in Hawaii. An investment in our public libraries is a direct investment in our communities. We look forward to working with the Senate Committee on Ways and Means in developing HSPLS' FY2023 supplemental budget during this legislative session.

Pearl City Library and Community Library Learning Center CIP Funding of \$28,000,000 for FY 2023. (See Attachment B)

We are respectfully requesting \$3 million to support the design of the new Pearl City Public Library and Community Library Learning Center, which will support the current planning funds that have already been allocated for an assessment and master plan of this library site. The estimated \$25 million in construction funds would be used to renovate the existing library for more efficient use of the space, replace the air conditioning system, repair structural issues, renovate public bathroom areas, repair and expand the existing parking lot, and construct the new CLLC programming space. The new programming space will allow HSPLS to expand its offering of community programs, for early learners to kupuna.

Thank you for this opportunity to present our budget information to your committee.

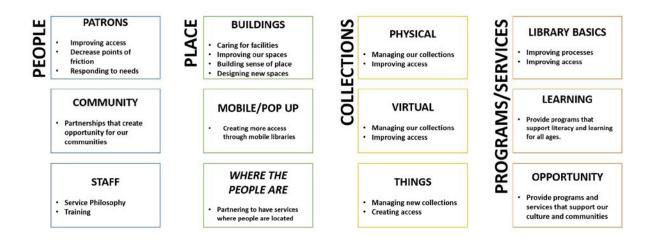

ATTACHMENT A

Supplemental Budget Request for FY23

The Hawaii State Public Library System's Supplemental Budget request for FY23 is based on our Strategic Framework and Areas of Focus. It is also based on the critical needs for our people, places, and collections.

HAWAII STATE PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM FRAMEWORK – AREAS OF FOCUS



PEOPLE

The pandemic has changed the way our libraries provide services, while at the same time challenging our ability to provide services with the current staffing levels. The pandemic has seen is loss of funding for sixty-nine of our positions, retirements, hiring freezes due to Reductions in Force, and challenges in hiring when we have been able to hire. Managing and keeping open 51 branches on 6 islands requires people.

1. \$130,000 for Student Helpers.

This funding will support the increased costs to provide up to 200 student helpers across our 51 branches to provide vital staffing support for shelving millions of items, cleaning and repairing materials, and providing assistance in programming for the public. At a time when it is difficult to recruit and hire permanent library staff, student helpers provide needed staffing statewide. These student helpers are important for our smallest of libraries, that struggle to keep the doors open, and our largest libraries that struggle to keep up and provide services. This program also supports workforce skill development and experience and an opportunity to earn money that is often saved to pay for future college experiences.

PLACE

We must continue to care for and provide safe spaces for our communities.

2. \$1,000,000 for Security Guards and Security Systems for 11 libraries.

Security has become increasingly important to the protection of State property and the personal safety of the library patrons and staff during public service hours, and when our libraries are closed.

Unfortunately, during the pandemic we have seen a rise in violent and destructive behavior both inside and outside of our buildings. Verbal abuse, pulling knives, spitting, throwing and destruction of library laptops, physical assault on staff as they leave work, and keying of staff cars are just a few examples of behavior our staff are dealing with now. Unfortunately, these are not one time occurrences; the frequency and intensity of the behavior has been disturbing.

Our current security contractor cannot provide appropriate staffing. They are not always trained or adept at interacting with the public, which is crucial for handling behavior issues. Eighty percent of our libraries are covered by the security contract, but in the past six months, there have been 123 instances where the security agency was unable to provide staffing at our libraries.

We must invest in our security guards to ensure they have the training and skills to handle critical situations, and make sure we have guards at the libraries that are most in need.

The outside of our buildings are also experiencing surges in violent and destructive behavior. In some locations, our staff are arriving to work where human waste has been smeared on staff doors, broken windows, and garbage everywhere. We have had stabbings after hours in our parking lot and an attempted kidnapping by knife point while our staff were inside the building. Staff tires have been slashed. Each time we have called on the police, they have asked if we have security cameras to help identify suspects. Eleven libraries have been identified as priority for installing security systems to protect staff, state property and support law enforcement.

The amount requested adds an additional \$150,000 to the budget for better trained security guards and \$850,000 for monitored security systems to eleven libraries, or a total increase of \$1M for security. The estimated cost for monitored security systems is based on analysis of two cost models for installation (cost to install based on \$8/sq ft. and one based on just equipment and labor) and potential monitoring fees per month when the libraries are not open. The actual costs will be based on the installation requirements of each of the buildings, which will vary due to existing electrical infrastructure and building types. The security systems will add an ongoing monitoring fee that must be factored into future operating budgets.

COLLECTIONS

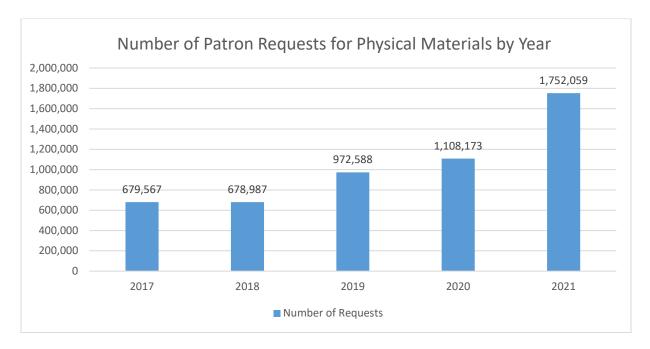
The Hawaii State Public Library System continues to face the challenges of a growing library system (now 51 branches), increasing costs of titles to provide multiple formats, and the need to provide more access to digital collections that are accessible for all of our islands. Collections are

a core service and are vital for creating opportunities for our communities to have access to the resources they need to be successful.

3. \$750,000 for Books and Library Materials.

During the pandemic, our physical and digital collections became increasingly more important to our communities. We saw increases in not only the use of digital books, but in requests for physical books for patrons to pick up. Last year, we hit over a million downloads of ebooks; data is showing that we reached 1,177,553 ebook checkouts in 2021.

Because we are a single public library system, any patron can request a title online from their library branch, or any other library branch and have it delivered to their local branch for pick up. The following chart shows the increase that we have seen in the last 5 years alone.

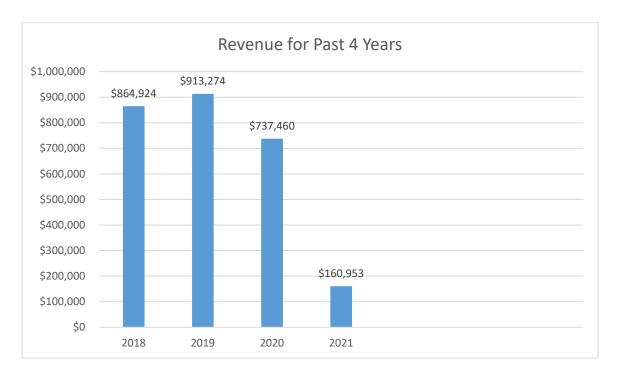


The continued increase is an indicator that physical collections and access to titles matters to our communities.

The current collection is almost entirely supported by Special Funds, which are the fines and fees charged to patrons for overdue, damaged and lost materials, fees charged for DVDs and meeting room rentals. While our revenue in general was declining, in large part due to changes in library patron behavior and the decline in DVD rentals and use of the app to track their due dates, the pandemic has created an even larger gap. This past fiscal year, we lost more than \$500,000 in special fund revenue due to our inability to provide all of our revenue-generating services, while usage of library resources increased.

The chart below shows the revenue for the past 4 years. Last year was one of the worst years for our revenue and creates a gap as we move forward. While we think we may see some

small increases in next year's revenue, the ongoing impacts of the pandemic are still unknown for the future.



The cost of running a 21st Century library requires a budget to make purchases of both physical and digital copies. With an increase in the number of ebook users, the demand for more copies continues to increase. Providing access to electronic collections is expensive, but it also enhances our ability to provide access to the same resources for patrons through all 51 branches across 6 islands, instead of requiring the purchase of multiple physical copies for every branch.

The following is an example of the cost to purchase one title in multiple formats. It demonstrates the change in the purchasing structure from 20 years ago when all the library needed to purchase was physical copies.

We must continue to bridge the physical and virtual collections, and it is vital that we have enough funding to have the collections that our communities need. Digital content has a different cost structure, directly affecting our ability to acquire and maintain the digital collection used by our library patrons.

When we pay for digital content we are only leasing copies of the material. Publishers have differing thresholds of when we must pay more to continue access to the publication; in other words, the cost of keeping the most popular publications that library patrons want, in our collection, will continuously rise. In the end, this means we must ensure there is a continuous stable source of funding to ensure patrons have access.

We are seeking alternatives for increasing revenue, but a consistent base level of funding ensures we can afford to provide patrons with the titles, materials and information resources that they need. A consistent base also enables us to look for new ways to remove barriers to access to our collections and materials for children and families, because we will not have to rely on fines to be one of the key supports of our budget.

Increasing our general fund base budget will ensure that funding for the purchase of physical and digital resources for all of our communities will be more stable, particularly if the pandemic continues to impact our ability to provide our full range of services to the public. As a core service, the base funding for the library collection must be increased to ensure equity of access to resources across the State.

SERVICES/PROGRAMS

In order to provide service between branches, we need vehicles that support the transportation of materials in a safe manner for our drivers.

4. \$100,000 for van for Hawaii Island and addition of lifts to vans on neighbor islands.

We continue to find more ways to be more cost effective, efficient and safe. We are requesting funding to purchase an additional van for Hawaii Island to support the work of our traveling janitor and provide additional delivery of material services. A new van costs approximately \$52,000. The remaining \$48,000 will be used to support the heath and efficiencies of our delivery drivers The lifts installed to the back of our delivery vans will enable our drivers to load heavy boxes of materials into the vans and minimize potential injury to our neighbor island drivers.

Due to the pandemic and an extreme staff shortage, all engineering positions in our Department's Central Services Division were vacant and we were not able to survey any of your Department's facilities. We are unaware of any major issues at your facilities and feel the last priority listing of projects are accurate.

Attached are copies of last year's prioritized backlog lists of repair/maintenance projects that you may use for the upcoming budget request for FY 2023. Upon request, staff from our Central Services Division will attend scope and consultant selection meetings and provide support when available.

The individual projects were scored and prioritized, by funding type. Also, projects that are ongoing or funded by your Department should be removed from the list.

The CIP and General funding needed were based on high priority projects (generally Condition rating '9' and above). Projects rated '9' and higher are energy related or the conditions may begin to affect occupants' operations. We recommend requesting for funds that were requested in last year's biennium budget request that were not received. The recommended budget request for last year was:

Pearl City Public Library and Community Library Learning Center

Introduction

The Pearl City Public Library opened on Nov. 15, 1969 and is one of the largest public libraries on O'ahu. As a regional library it was built to support not only the local community but also the smaller libraries in the region.

The library is located on Waimano Home Road and is close to the Pearl City Elementary School, public housing, shopping, public park space and other Pearl City neighborhoods. Waimano Home Road and nearby Kamehameha Highway serve as main arteries for the City's public bus system. In 1970, the population of Pearl City was roughly 19,600; in 2021 it is now 45,605. With the increasing trend in population growth, we need to expand and upgrade the library's learning spaces to meet the changing needs of the community.

The current library is 14,000 sq. feet and offers a children's room, Young Adult area, large reading room, computers, WiFi, a meeting room for the public and parking. The library also has roughly .9 acres of adjacent property that was originally purchased by the State to expand parking for library users.

The Pearl City Public Library continues to be a vital point of social infrastructure and an anchor for the region. An expansion project would be an opportunity to reimagine this entire space to better serve the changing and growing needs of the community.

Reimagined Public Library & New Community Library Learning Center

We are proposing to not only update and renovate the current library building, but to extend the space to the adjacent vacant library lot to build a Community Library Learning Center (CLLC). The CLLC would provide many more opportunities for the community to meet and create individual, small group and large sized learning experiences. We would also realign the parking to accommodate the needs of the community and safe use of the library and CLLC.

Reimagined Public Library

The current library building would be redesigned to replace the air conditioning system, electrical and plumbing infrastructure, broadband network, and open public areas of the library. Updated traditional spaces for seating and collections of books and things (i.e. ukuleles) will be reimagined and integrated with:

- 1) Flexible small meeting rooms for studying that can be expanded to larger meeting spaces;
- 2) Upgrade the digital/technology equipment with the latest tech; and
- 3) Create maker spaces for communities to learn and create.

An area outside the library would be built with Wifi access for groups in the community to meet and access the internet in a new type of library experience that utilizes Hawaii's unique climate advantages.

Realignment of the space would also allow for a new and more efficient central processing center in the existing staff support area, for library materials delivered throughout Central and West Oahu. All designs would maximize flexibility of all library spaces, and allow for the ability to easily adapt to the needs of the community.

Community Library Learning Center

A pathway will be built across the property to the currently vacant space, where the Community Library Learning Center will be built. The flexible 2,000 – 3,000 square foot building will be able to adapt and support various community uses, from early learning programs and/or child care, library programs, kupuna classes and a meeting space for the community. Outside the CLLC will be a small play and learning area for keiki. We believe that the Pearl City Library could be the model for the future of the Hawaii State Public Library System's regional public library spaces.

Request

We are respectfully requesting \$28 million to support the design of the new Pearl City Public Library and Community Library Learning Center - \$3m for design and \$25m for construction. The funds will support an earlier budget appropriation to complete a building assessment and master plan of the Pearl City Public Library. The consultant has already been selected and DAGS is in the process of finalizing the scope of work and contract with the consultant.

he Hawaii State Public Library System (HSPLS) is made up of 51 unique library locations across six islands. Our public libraries are trusted and valued places that provide opportunities for everyone to learn, grow, and be together as a community. Our responsibility is to ensure that these spaces remain accessible, safe and comfortable for everyone. With sixty percent of HSPLS branches built before 1970 and over forty-six percent of these are 50+ years old we need your continued support.

Public libraries continue to be important social infrastructure for recovery and connection because they are open to all and provide our communities with access to educational resources, internet access, job searching, skill building classes, caring staff to help, and connection to other people in the community with just a library card.

This year, we would like to highlight two renovation projects which we were able to complete during the pandemic: Liliha Public Library and Naalehu Public Library.



Liliha Public Library

Over 50 years old, this important community library was in need of extensive repairs and renovations to ensure the health and viability of the building for future generations. Renovations included: fixing structural issues, ground stabilization, resurfacing the roof-top parking lot, replacing skylights and installing new light fixtures, replacing plumbing and sewer lines, air conditioning system improvements, renovating restrooms for ADA-accessibility, refurbishing staff work areas, painting the interior and installing new flooring, planting new landscaping, installing new mobile shelving, furniture and signage, and creating a special room for the Chinese Language Collection. The community's response has been overwhelmingly positive because they now have a new modern space to engage and enjoy.

Naalehu Public Library

Naalehu is the southernmost library in the United States, and our smallest library. Following a two-year expansion project, the newly renovated Naalehu Public Library grew from a 775 sq. ft. "portable" to a 1,676 sq. ft. library to better meet the needs of the community. The new library now has a children's reading area, staff room, bathroom, new signage, and a new parking lot. The community loves their new, bigger and brighter public library.



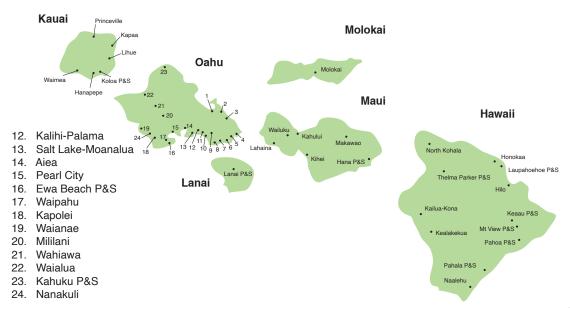
For the remaining libraries, the figures for renovation and improvements have been estimated by the Department of Accounting and General Services. While the lists are not comprehensive or complete, they provide HSPLS with a snapshot of critical building infrastructure needs for long-term planning. We are grateful for the support and commitment of the Board of Education, Governor, and State Legislature for allowing us to refresh and restore our library spaces for our communities.

On June 19, 2021, we re-opened the Liliha Public Library after making approximately \$2.7m in extensive repairs and renovations to the building and creating a special room for the Chinese Language Collection.
