
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION TO REEVALUATE AND ADOPT
ADMINISTRATIVE RULES RELATING TO THE REMOVAL OF ABANDONED
OR DOUBLE UTILITY POLES, LINES, AND EQUIPMENT.

1 WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission regulates all
2 chartered, franchised, certificated, and registered public
3 utility companies operating in the State; and
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5 WHEREAS, the Public Utilities Commission's administrative
6 rules adopted the 2002 edition of the National Electrical Safety
7 Code as it pertains to the installation, operation, and
8 maintenance of overhead and underground electrical supply and
9 communication lines; and
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11 WHEREAS, the 2002 edition of the National Electrical Safety
12 Code states that "[l]ines and equipment permanently abandoned
13 shall be removed or maintained in a safe condition"; and
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15 WHEREAS, Hawaiian Electric Company, Inc. (Hawaiian
16 Electric) is a utility company in the State that provides
17 electric services via lines using wooden poles within existing
18 county and state street rights-of-way to residential communities
19 and businesses; and
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21 WHEREAS, Hawaiian Electric owns over 120,000 utility poles
22 on the island of Oahu; and
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24 WHEREAS, when a new utility pole is installed adjacent to
25 an existing utility pole for the purpose of transferring
26 electric, telephone, cable, or other wires from one pole to
27 another, the original pole is often left in place, resulting in
28 what is referred to as double poles; and
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1 WHEREAS, there are thousands of derelict utility poles,
2 double poles, and utility lines abandoned across Hawaii
3 neighborhoods; and

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5 WHEREAS, the derelict utility and communication lines,
6 abandoned utility poles, and redundant double poles should be
7 removed in a timely manner due to their growing threat to public
8 safety; and

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10 WHEREAS, the removal of unnecessary and unsightly derelict
11 lines and poles will eliminate a potential public hazard,
12 organize communication and utility pole lines, and favorably
13 influence the surrounding community; now, therefore,

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15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
16 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
17 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Public
18 Utilities Commission is urged to reevaluate and adopt
19 administrative rules relating to the removal of abandoned lines,
20 double poles, and equipment; and

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22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Public Utilities Commission
23 is requested to adopt updated provisions of the National
24 Electrical Safety Code to streamline the removal of double poles
25 and other unsafe abandoned equipment; and

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27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Commissioners of the
29 Public Utilities Commission and President and Chief Executive
30 Officer of the Hawaiian Electric Company, Inc.
