## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONVENE A VEGETATION MANAGEMENT WORKING GROUP TO STUDY, EVALUATE, AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING REGULATIONS THAT DEFINE PROPERTY OWNER OBLIGATIONS TO PERFORM VEGETATION MANAGEMENT ON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PROPERTY FOR PURPOSES OF WILDFIRE RISK MITIGATION.

1 WHEREAS, on August 8, 2023, catastrophic wildfires swept through various communities on the island of Maui; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the wildfires impacted human life, the community, 4 housing, education, the economy, the environment, and the health 5 of Maui residents; and 6 7 WHEREAS, a significant issue regarding fire safety is the 8 presence of grasses, trees, and other vegetation adjacent to or 9 under electric utility lines; and 10 11 WHEREAS, in response to the wildfires, the House of 12 Representatives established six interim working groups charged 13 with evaluating specific topics related to the wildfires and 14 making recommendations for specific legislative action; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, the Wildfire Prevention Working Group, as one of the six aforementioned working groups, found that people are the 18 primary drivers of wildfires in Hawaii, as ninety-nine percent 19 of wildfires are caused by human ignitions; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the Wildfire Prevention Working Group also found 22 that guinea grass, fountain grass, molasses grass, and 23 buffelgrass can form continuous fuel beds, ignite easily, attain 24 25 extremely high fine fuel loads, and are capable of growing back more vigorously in the post-fire environment than the majority 26 27 of native vegetation; and 28



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WHEREAS, utility companies have miles of utility lines 1 2 installed throughout the State on government and private land, including within the public rights of way and mountainous areas 3 of the State; and 4 5 WHEREAS, a significant portion of the aforementioned public 6 and private lands is covered with unmanaged grasses, trees, and 7 other vegetation that may pose wildfire risk; and 8 9 WHEREAS, further study is necessary for policy, regulation, 10 and guidance pertaining to the management of and responsibility 11 for vegetation on public and private lands for wildlife risk 12 13 mitigation purposes; now, therefore, 14 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 15 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 16 Session of 2024, that the Department of Land and Natural 17 18 Resources is urged to convene a Vegetation Management Working Group to study, evaluate, and make recommendations regarding 19 regulations that define property owner obligations to perform 20 vegetation management on public and private property for 21 purposes of wildfire risk mitigation; and 22 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Vegetation Management Working Group is requested to focus on solutions to reduce 25 wildfire risk and the possibility of establishing a vegetation 26 management program as it relates to landowners and public 27 utilities; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Vegetation Management 30 Working Group, in its review of vegetation management, is 31 32 requested to consider the wildfire mitigation actions that are being proposed as part of the Hawaiian Electric Company's 33 Climate Adaptation Transmission and Distribution Resilience 34 Program in Docket No. 2022-0135 and the electric utilities' 35 (including Kauai Island Utility Cooperative) hazard mitigation 36 37 plans to be filed with the Public Utilities Commission (Commission) over the next few months, in response to Commission 38 Order No. 40396. These plans will be filed as part of a non-39 docketed proceeding under Case No. 2023-04661; and 40 41
