A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SMALL PURCHASES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that escalating costs of 2 goods over the years, particularly during the coronavirus 3 disease 2019 pandemic, have created numerous difficulties 4 regarding small purchase procurement. With the tragic August 5 2023 wildfires in Maui and the growing frequency of earthquakes 6 on Hawaii island, an indicator of potential devastating volcanic 7 eruption effects on residential and commercial areas, as seen in 8 2018, the need to address small purchase procurements has become 9 inescapable.

10 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

11 (1)Increase the minimum amount for purchases constituting 12 small purchase procurements from \$25,000 to \$50,000; 13 (2) Set the minimum amount for purchases constituting 14 small purchase procurements within the affected area 15 of a federally declared disaster at \$75,000; and 16 (3) Require the state procurement office to submit a 17 report to the legislature on the efficacy of the



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increased procurement amounts for areas affected by a
 federally declared disaster.

3 SECTION 2. Section 103D-305, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

"§103D-305 Small purchases; prohibition against parceling. 5 (a) Procurements of less than \$100,000 for goods or services, 6 7 or \$250,000 for construction shall be made in accordance with 8 procedures set forth in rules adopted by the policy board that 9 are designed to ensure administrative simplicity and as much 10 competition as is practicable; provided that multiple 11 expenditures shall not be created at the inception of a 12 transaction or project so as to evade the requirements of this 13 chapter; and provided further that procurement requirements shall not be artificially divided or parceled so as to 14 15 constitute a small purchase under this section.

16 (b) Procurements greater than \$50,000 for construction 17 under subsection (a) shall require security by performance and 18 payment bonds, pursuant to section 103D-324, delivered to the 19 procurement officer, that are:

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(1) In a form prescribed by the rules of the policy board;

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1 (2) Executed by a surety company authorized to do business 2 in this State; and 3 (3) In an amount equal to one hundred per cent of the 4 price specified in the contract, 5 or shall otherwise be secured by a performance bond in a manner 6 satisfactory to the procurement officer. 7 (C) [Procurements] Except as provided in subsection (d), 8 procurements of $[\frac{25,000}{50,000}]$ \$50,000 to less than \$250,000 shall be 9 made in accordance with small purchase procedures; provided that 10 [such] small purchase procurements through an electronic system 11 shall be required. 12 (d) In an affected area of a federally declared disaster, 13 procurements of \$75,000 to less than \$250,000 shall be made in 14 accordance with small purchase procedures; provided that small 15 purchase procurements through an electronic system shall be 16 required; provided further that procurements pursuant to this 17 subsection shall be reported to the state procurement office." 18 SECTION 3. The state procurement office shall submit a 19 report of its findings and recommendations on the efficacy of 20 the amendment to section 103D-305, Hawaii Revised Statutes, made 21 by section 1 of this Act, including any proposed legislation, to

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1 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening 2 of the regular session of 2025. 3 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 5 begun before its effective date. 6 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

8 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2112.

Increases the minimum amount for purchases constituting small purchase procurements from \$25,000 to \$50,000.
