## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE HEALTH PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 323D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted 3 and to read as follows: 4 ""Health care" means the improvement of a person's health 5 through the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and amelioration 6 or cure of disease, illness, injury, or other physical and 7 mental impairment, regardless of the setting in which those 8 services are delivered. "Health care" includes oral health, behavioral health, and long-term care." 9 10 SECTION 2. Section 323D-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "§323D-12 Health planning and development functions; state 13 **agency.** (a) The state agency shall: 14 (1) Have as a principal function the responsibility for 15 promoting [accessibility for all the people of the 16 State to quality health care services at reasonable cost. The state agency shall conduct such studies and 17



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1		investigations as may be necessary as to the causes of
2		health care costs including inflation. The state
3		agency-may-contract for services to implement this
4		paragraph. The certificate of need program mandated
5		under part V shall serve this function. The state
6		agency-shall-promote the sharing of facilities-or
7		services by health-care providers whenever possible-to
8		achieve economies and shall restrict unusual or
9		unusually costly services to individual facilities or
10		providers where appropriate;] universal access to
11		high-quality, equitable, and affordable health care
12		for all the people of the State;
13	(2)	[Serve as staff-to-and provide technical assistance
14		and advice to the statewide council and the subarea
15		councils in the preparation, review, and revision of
16		the state health services and facilities plan;]
17		Provide, throughout state government, leadership and
18		coordination of activities and resources that affect
19		health care access and quality, including health
20		insurance coverage rates, health insurance benefits,
21		affordability, workforce health, reimbursements,



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1		quality, administrative simplification, workforce
2		development, and health information technology;
3	(3)	[Conduct the health planning activities of the State
4		in coordination with the subarea councils, implement
5		the state health services and facilities plan, and
6		determine the statewide health needs of the State
7		after consulting with the statewide council; and]
8		Establish a state health services, workforce, and
9		facilities plan and update that plan every four years
10		following consultation with the statewide council;
11	(4)	Administer the state certificate of need program
12		pursuant to part $V[-]$ , and serve as staff to and
13		provide technical assistance and advice for the
14		statewide council and subarea councils; and
15	(5)	Develop an annual state global budget based on total
16		costs of health care to:
17		(A) Prevent costs from rising faster than general
18		inflation; and
19		(B) Assure affordability of health care services;
20		provided that the plan shall be developed no later
21		than 2025 and shall be updated annually thereafter;



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1		provided further that the plan shall be developed and
2		updated in consultation with the governor, department
3		of budget and finance, the board of trustees of the
4		Hawaii employer-union health benefits trust fund, and
5		all administrators of public and private health plans
6		and providers of health insurance coverage.
7	(b)	The state agency may:
8	(1)	Prepare [such-reports and recommendations]:
9		(A) Reports;
10		(B) Related health statistics as necessary to monitor
11		and improve health care access, outcomes, equity,
12		quality, costs, and cost-effectiveness; and
13		(C) Recommendations,
14		on Hawaii's health care costs and public or private
15		efforts to reduce or control costs and <u>improve</u> health
16		care quality as [it] the state agency deems necessary.
17		[The] <u>A</u> report may include[ <del>, but not be limited to,</del> ] a
18		review of health insurance plans, the availability of
19		various kinds of health insurance and malpractice
20		insurance to consumers, and strategies for increasing



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1		competition in the health insurance field[-] and
2		across the health care delivery system;
3	[ <del>(2)</del>	Prepare and revise as necessary the state health
4		services and facilities plan.
5	<del>-(3)</del> -	Prepare, review, and revise the annual implementation
6		<del>plan.</del>
7	<del>.(4)</del> ]	(2) Assist the statewide council in the performance
8		of its functions [-];
9	[ <del>-(5)</del> ]	(3) Determine the need for new health services
10		proposed to be offered within the State $[-]$ ;
11	[ <del>-(6)</del> ]	(4) Assess existing health care services and
12		facilities to determine whether there are redundant,
13		excessive, or inappropriate services or facilities and
14		make public findings of any that are found to be so.
15		The state agency shall weigh the costs of the health
16		care services or facilities against the benefits the
17		services or facilities provide and there shall be a
18		negative presumption against marginal services $[-]$ ;
19	[ <del>(7)</del> ]	(5) Provide technical assistance to persons, public
20		or private, in obtaining and filling out the necessary
21		forms for the development of projects and programs $[-]$ :



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1	[ <del>(8)</del> ]	(6) Prepare reports, studies, and recommendations on
2		emerging health issues, such as medical ethics, health
3		care rationing, involuntary care, care for the
4		indigent, and standards for research and development
5		of biotechnology [and], genetic engineering[-], remote
6		monitoring, artificial intelligence, and workforce
7		development; and
8	[ <del>-(9-)-</del> ]	(7) Conduct [ <del>such</del> ] other activities as are necessary
9		to meet the purposes of this chapter."
10	SECT	ION 3. In accordance with section 9 of article VII, of
11	the Const	itution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
12	37-93, На	waii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
13	that the	appropriation contained in this Act will cause the
14	state gen	eral fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025
15	to be exc	eeded by \$ , or per cent. The reasons
16	for excee	ding the general fund expenditure ceiling are that the
17	appropria	tion made in this Act is necessary to serve the public
18	interest	and to meet the needs provided for by this Act.
19	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
21	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for

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1	administr	ative costs and to establish the following positions
2	within th	e state health planning and development agency:
3	(1)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) administrative
4		specialist IV position;
5	(2)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) research
6		statistician VI position, who shall serve as a state
7		healthcare informatician;
8	(3)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) research
9		statistician V position, who shall serve as an
10		administrative data specialist;
11	. (4)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
12		VI position, who shall serve as a state health
13		planner;
14	(5)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
15		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
16		liaison for the county of Hawaii;
17	(6)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
18		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
19		liaison for the county of Kauai;

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1	(7)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
2		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
3		liaison for the county of Maui; and
4	(8)	One full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) program specialist
5		IV position, who shall serve as a health planning
6		liaison for the city and county of Honolulu.
7	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
8	health fo	or the purposes of this Act.
