A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VALUE-ADDED PRODUCTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that establishing a food
- 2 and product innovation network is critical to meeting the
- 3 State's agricultural and economic diversification goals. The
- 4 network will allow businesses in the State to capitalize
- 5 globally on the "made in Hawaii", "produced in Hawaii", or
- 6 "processed in Hawaii" brand; create world-class products; and
- 7 scale up production by providing the businesses with access to a
- 8 diverse suite of manufacturing equipment and industry expertise.
- 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
- 10 statewide network of open-access food and value-added product
- 11 development facilities to enable businesses to scale up new
- 12 products from research and development to manufacturing and
- 13 commercialization.
- 14 SECTION 2. Chapter 163D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 16 and to read as follows:

14	network s	hall include:

4	(c)	The food and product innovation network shall:

9		management, workforce development, intellectual			
10		property protection, and other related topics;			
11	(2)	Provide new product development support from			
12		early-stage trials to commercialization by			
13		establishing a network of facilities that have			
14		equipment of various scales, providing expert advice,			
15		and offering resources tailored to the regional			
16		economies;			
17	(3)	Provide low-risk commercial production with			
18	appropriate certifications for exporting products as				
19		selling products locally;			
20	(4)	Provide recommendations on process optimization by			
21		offering advice and networking, identifying and			

1		testing equipment, planning trials, and analyzing		
2		results;		
3	(5) Increase exports by securing facilities and developing			
4		compliance programs for off-shore markets; provided		
5	that each county shall have not more than two food ar			
6	product innovation network facilities that produce			
7	products labeled "made in Hawaii", "produced in			
8		Hawaii", or "processed in Hawaii" pursuant to		
9		section 486-119;		
10	(6)	Create and implement programs that promote		
11	entrepreneurial development to grow the State's			
12		economy; and		
13	<u>(7)</u>	Prepare businesses to scale up and to achieve		
14		autonomous business success and sustainability.		
15	<u>(d)</u>	No later than twenty days prior to the convening of		
16	each regu	lar session, the food and product innovation network		
17	shall sub	mit a report to the legislature that includes:		
18	(1)	A description of the food and product innovation		
19		network's activities and progress in the preceding		
20		year, including the activities and progress of primary		

1		members and partner members, in response to the	
2		directives established pursuant to subsection (c);	
3	(2)	An assessment of any progress made in growing the	
4		State's agriculture industry, food industry, and	
5		related industries, and in meeting the State's food	
6		security goals; and	
7	<u>(3)</u>	Any proposed legislation."	
8	SECT	ION 3. Section 163D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
9	amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately		
10	inserted	and to read as follows:	
11	" <u>"</u> Pa	rtner member" means an open-access food and value-added	
12	product d	evelopment facility that is part of the food and	
13	product i	nnovation network but is not managed or operated by the	
14	corporati	on.	
15	<u>"Pri</u>	mary member" means an open-access food and value-added	
16	product d	evelopment facility that is part of the food and	
17	product i	nnovation network and is managed and operated by the	
18	corporati	on."	
19	SECT	ION 4. Section 163D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
20	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:	
21	"(b)	The corporation shall [develop,]:	

1	(1)	Develop, promote, assist, and market agricultural
2		products for local consumption, and shall promote and
3		assist in commercial export of agricultural
4		products[-]; and
5	(2)	Oversee the food and product innovation network
6		pursuant to section 163D- ; provided that the
7		responsibilities and operations of each partner member
8		shall remain with the partner member."
9	SECT	ION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
10	the Hawai	i State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
11	Hawaii Re	vised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
12	appropria	tions contained in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023,
13	and this	Act will cause the state general fund expenditure
14	ceiling f	or fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
15	\$	or per cent. This current declaration takes
16	into acco	ount general fund appropriations authorized for fiscal
17	year 2024	-2025 in Act 164, Regular Session of 2023, and this Act
18	only. Th	e reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure

- 7 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
